General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Authorize the Director of the Health Department to submit an application for up to \$225,000 per year for five years to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's Striving to Reduce Youth Violence Everywhere (STRYVE) through Local Public Health Leadership grant program.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

In certain East Multnomah County neighborhoods, youth ages 10-24 experience high rates of violent crime perpetration, violent crime victimization, and injuries and mortality due to violence. Research shows that youth violence can be prevented through addressing community indicators for violent crimes (e.g., poverty, low academic achievement, low school engagement, etc.) through strategies involving multiple sectors of the community. The purpose of the STRYVE grant program is to assist public health departments in leading a multi-sector coalition to prevent youth violence using STRYVE tools within high-risk communities, like East County.

STRYVE is a national initiative led by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to prevent youth violence before it starts. STRYVE's vision is safe and healthy youth who can achieve their full potential as connected and contributing members of thriving, violence-free families, schools, and communities. Projects funded by the STRYVE program will be comprehensive (involving policy, programs, and practices) and will span at least two levels of the socio-ecologic model of health (individual, relationship, community, and societal). STRYVE is evidence-based and reflects the latest research on violence prevention.

With STRYVE funding, the Multnomah County Health Department Community Capacitation Center will build a coalition involving representatives from Health Department Leadership, education, youth-serving agencies, family and social service agencies, public safety, juvenile justice, mental health, labor, faith-based organizations, local businesses, and local police to implement youth violence prevention in East County. The coalition will engage in two phases over the five-year project period: Phase 1 (years 1 and 2) will include coalition development, strategic planning, resource identification, and capacity assessment; Phase 2 (years 3-5) will include the implementation and evaluation of the strategic plan developed by the coalition during Phase 1.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

This grant will provide the Multnomah County Health Department's Community Capacitation Center with up to \$225,000 per year for five years to build a multi-sector coalition to plan and implement strategies to prevent youth violence in East Multnomah County.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

The Health Department will work the Department of Community Justice, Portland and Gresham Police, and community based organizations to develop the grant application and implement the project. In addition, we will coordinate our efforts with the Local Public Safety Coordinating Committee (LPSCC) to assure that the prevention work conducted as part of this grant articulates effectively with the intervention and suppression activities conducted by our County partners.

- **Who is the granting agency?**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The purpose of this grant is to increase the use of comprehensive youth violence prevention strategies that are based on the best available evidence within high-risk communities in East Multnomah County.

Cost sharing/matching is not required. Annual reports and financial status reports are due at the end of each 12 month budget period, and final performance and financial status reports are due at the end of the five-year project period.

- **Explain grant funding detail – is this a one time only or long term commitment?**
The grant will provide the Health Department with up to \$225,000 each year for five years.
- **What are the estimated filing timelines?**
The application is due June 13, 2011.
- **If a grant, what period does the grant cover?**
The grant covers the five year period of approximately October 2011 through September 2016.
- **When the grant expires, what are funding plans?**
Other funding sources, such as grants, will be sought. A requirement of the grant is to identify at least one potential funding mechanism designated to sustain or expand the coalition and its work before the end of the project period.
- **Is 100% of the central and departmental indirect recovered? If not, please explain why.**
All indirect costs associated with the project will be covered with grant funds.
