## General Information

### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Requesting the Board of County Commissioners proclaim October 2017 as Infrastructure Month in recognition of the importance of planning and investing in infrastructure that continuously improves public access to critical community programs and services while supporting a healthy, safe and prosperous community.

Multnomah County has provided public access to critical programs and services through infrastructure for over 150 years. Much of this infrastructure has shaped the landscape of our community from the Vista House, Multnomah County Courthouse and the Hawthorne Bridge to iconic roads, bridges and building. The infrastructure provides access to place, knowledge, and to the critical programs and services needed for a healthy and thriving community. It moves people literally and figuratively. The County is engaged in a 20-year capital infrastructure planning process that holistically approaches the way we provide access to services in a safe, adaptable, resilient, equitable and sustainable manner. The County understands infrastructure no longer falls under a single category such as roads, bridges, buildings or technology but are technological hybrids that require multi-disciplinary expertise and holistic thinking to maximize return on investment. In addition, the County remains focused on providing uninterrupted programs and service to our community during uncertainty and building infrastructure that addresses existing needs while planning for the long term. The Strategic Capital Planning Program plans

to reach out to community partners in October as it develops the first 20-year strategic capital plan to understand the benefits and challenges of accessing County programs and services. In anticipation of this effort, the Program proposes this proclamation to raise awareness and recognize the value infrastructure has in supporting a thriving community.
