

SUBJECT: Tax Supervising and Conservation Hearing on Supplemental Budget

I. Recommendation/Action Requested:

I request that Commissioners attend the hearing at 11:30 on February 22, 1994 where the Tax Supervising Commission will review the supplemental budget.

II. Background / Analysis

The TSCC hearing is a requirement for a supplemental budget that does anything other than increase the revenues in an existing fund less than ten percent. Because the Approved Supplemental Budget creates an entirely new fund, and establishes a significantly different program, the County must submit the proposal to Tax Supervising for its review.

The Supplemental Budget is primarily to record the implementation of Care Oregon. I have attached the memorandum I sent to Margaret Bauer to explain the context for the supplemental budget. If you need copies of the Supplemental Budget itself for review prior to the meeting, please contact me (248-3822) or Kathy Innes (248-2306).

III. Financial Impact:

The Supplemental Budget adds an estimate of approximately \$11.7 million to County revenues and authorizes the expenditure of this additional amount.

There is no financial impact to the hearing itself.

IV. Legal Issues

ORS 294.480 establishes the parameters for supplemental budgets, and defines the basic supplemental budget processes; ORS 294.480 (3) and (4) say when the Board can adopt the supplemental budget without going before TSCC and the circumstances calling for a Tax Supervising hearing.

V. Controversial Issues

I do not know of any. The Oregon Health Plan, and the rationing of services it entails, may be subjects of policy or program level questions.

VII. Citizen Participation

The Tax Supervising hearing is a public meeting designed to be a formal avenue for citizens to review the supplemental budget, both as an opportunity for public testimony and because the Tax Supervising Commission is itself a body made up of citizens convened to provide citizen input to budget processes.

VIII. Other Government Participation:

The State of Oregon is involved with CareOregon and several other counties and jurisdictions are potentially subcontractors under CareOregon. Intergovernmental agreements will give the Board a chance to review the relationships with these jurisdictions. They will not be part of this hearing.

SUBJECT: Supplemental Budget

The Supplemental Budget includes two items: revenues and appropriations associated with CareOregon, and additional Forest Reserve receipts in the County School Fund.

CAREOREGON

CareOregon is the fancy name for the Oregon Health Plan that has been much discussed during the last two years. It involves provision of a set of medical services to a population of Oregonians who meet State of Oregon income guidelines based on the Federal Poverty Level.

The program is funded with Medicaid payments. Medicaid is a Federal entitlement program. Individuals who meet the income requirements have a right to medical services. Medicaid funding comes from a "pot" of money accumulated at the State level, 2/3 Federal dollars, 1/3 State dollars. Because this pot of money cannot cover everyone, there are two ways to restrict its use: limit the number of eligible people or limit the kinds of services that the pot will pay for. Historically, the limitation has been applied to the number of people. This has been accomplished by progressively lowering the income level of those who are eligible. Prior to the Federal acceptance of the Oregon Health Plan, that income level had declined to between 60% and 65% of the Federal Poverty Level. That means that in order to be a Medicaid eligible client, a person or family income could not exceed 65% of the Federal Poverty Level. [Note, this is an oversimplification because there are separate categories for pregnant women, , etc., and their income eligibility requirements differ. However, it is a good general guideline.]

The Oregon Health Plan restricts Medicaid use by limiting the kinds of services that will be covered. This allows expansion of the number of people who can be served, although it means that some medical treatment will not be provided to any of them.

The set of covered services has been prioritized by the State Department of Health to de-emphasize treatments for catastrophic health problems that have low recovery rates and to emphasize prevention and "basic" medical care.

Multnomah County now provides primary care medical services to Medicaid-eligible clients in two ways. Under a capitation plan, the County receives a monthly payment for primary care services from the State

Office of Medical Assistance Payments (OMAP) for each enrollee. In addition, when the County provides primary care services to clients who are Medicaid eligible but are not enrolled in a PCO, the County bills OMAP on a fee for service basis. Under the Oregon Health Plan, the Medicaid payment system will change.

OMAP has contracted with Multnomah County as a fully capitated health organization. The contract obligates Multnomah County to provide medical care, both primary care, specialist care, and hospital care, for all eligible Oregonians who enroll in CareOregon. Multnomah County will receive an average of \$119 per month for each CareOregon client (a weighted average, the capitation rates differ depending on the Medicaid eligibility category). Multnomah County, in turn, is subcontracting with other health care providers throughout the state to provide the medical care to which the eligible population is entitled. The County acts as the manager of contracts to provide the care and is responsible for claims administration.

The total number of Medicaid eligible clients will increase as a result of the Oregon Health Plan because clients will be eligible if they have income up to 100% of Federal Poverty Level. Eligible citizens can enroll in a variety of health plans throughout the state -- the choice is theirs. In Multnomah County, and in many cities along the Willamette Valley corridor, if they choose a public health provider, their care will be paid through CareOregon. The number who enroll in CareOregon will determine the revenue stream for the capitated system.

The County believes, based on projections by the Oregon Primary Care Association, that the enrollment in CareOregon will look like this:

The revenue figures in the Supplemental Budget are based on the above assumptions about CareOregon enrollment through June 1994.

The Supplemental Budget creates a fund exclusively to track the revenues and expenditures associated with this plan. The fund will be accounted for on an enterprise basis. This is important because it is not the Board's intention to subsidize the State health program with local tax revenues. Setting up the operation in a separate fund will allow the financial position of the plan to be tracked accurately and easily.

The expenditures in the CareOregon Fund include management staff to operate the program, overhead costs to reimburse expenses incurred by Multnomah County, and contractual payments for health care. Because the contracts have not yet been signed with all subcontractors, the following numbers represent the County's estimate of the distribution of the total revenue we believe will be available this fiscal year.

The most important subcontract will be with the Oregon Health Sciences University (OHSU). OHSU will provide the required hospital inpatient component of CareOregon. OHSU will, in turn, contract with other hospitals around the state for hospital treatment to be provided to CareOregon clients who do not reside in the metropolitan area. The contract with OHSU will transfer approximately \$48 per month to OHSU for each CareOregon enrollee, nearly \$2 million for the remainder of this fiscal year based on the estimated CareOregon enrollment.

Because one of the major providers of primary care services to eligible enrollees will be the Multnomah County Primary Care Clinic system, the CareOregon Fund will make payments to the Federal/State Fund (where we account for the County clinics) in the same way it pays any of the other primary care subcontractors in the state. This payment is expected to be about the same amount as the Medicaid revenue the County received under the previous payment procedures.

About \$7 million is budgeted for payments to other health care providers around the state and for specialist services for the balance of this fiscal year.

COUNTY SCHOOL FUND

The Adopted 1993-94 Budget estimated the Forest Reserve Yield in the County School Fund at an amount considerably lower than the actual receipts have turned out to be. By statute, this revenue (1/4 of the total from the Forest Reserve Yield, revenue from timber cut on Federal forest lands) must be passed through to the Education Service District. The supplemental budget action corrects the revenue estimate and authorizes the payment.
