General Information:

1. Brief overview of grant's purpose and/or impact.

Business Oregon's Brownfields Program offers grant financing options for cleanup projects on properties impacted by the existence of hazardous substances and for which cleanup is necessary in order for development or redevelopment to occur.

Eligible Projects Assistance is targeted to economic or community development projects showing the greatest need and exhibiting long-term project viability. Examples of eligible redevelopment projects the program will support include business development projects, industrial lands capacity projects, community facility projects and downtown or mixed use revitalization projects. The cleanup project must be associated with redevelopment of the property.

2. Brief overview of how proposal is aligned with Department's strategic direction.

The Grant funds would be applied to environmental site technical work for the Vance Properties in East County.

The purpose of the Vance Property Project is to develop and implement a feasibility study and a master planning process to propose options and recommendations for any future development and/or disposition of the county-owned parcels in this area.

The outcomes of the planning will prioritize the needs and future uses of the Department of Community Services and other county departments. Stakeholder engagement and multi-jurisdictional partnership is integral to the process.

The grant would cover part of the contract costs of a civil engineering design firm to assess alternatives to address how stormwater is treated on the property. The existing stormwater system will be assessed on the Vance properties compared to the new standards that are being implemented for stormwater by the City of Gresham. This will yield information on the preliminary design and size of a facility, or pair of facilities, that can treat stormwater generated from the Vance and Yeon properties. This information will be used to develop a master plan for the subject properties.

3. Describe any community and/or government input considered in planning for this grant.

The Vance Properties Project Team has established a partnership with Oregon's Regional Solutions Team (ORST). The ORST have named the Vance Project as a priority project under their purview. County project staff have participated in four meetings to date with ORST who has been providing County Staff connections to resources and technical guidance.

The City of Gresham, Gresham Redevelopment Commission, University of Oregon, Landscape Architecture Design Studio and the Rockwood Neighborhood Association are all engaged in the project, specifically related to the economic development and future site master planning processes.

4. What partners may be included in program activities?

Oregon Regional Solutions Team, City of Gresham, Gresham Redevelopment Commission, Rockwood Neighborhood Association, Centennial Neighborhood Association and Multnomah County Environmental Health.

5. Generally, what are the grant's reporting requirements?

There are no set reporting requirements. Funds are disbursed on a cost recovery basis which means that an invoice is included with each disbursement request that is submitted. No deliverable is required other than the invoice.
