**IDENTIFICATION OF THE TARGET NEIGHBORHOOD / NEIGHBORHOOD BOUNDARIES:** The Albina target neighborhood is roughly 25 square blocks and is comprised of the following boundaries in Portland: North: Rosa Parks Way; South: North Russell Street; West: Interstate-5; East: Northeast 7th Avenue.

**THE TARGET NEIGHBORHOOD'S NEED FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ENHANCEMENT GRANT:**

Disproportionate amount of crime and disorder in this target neighborhood.

**GOALS OF THE PROJECT:** 1) Prevent and reduce violent crime in the Albina target neighborhood by interdicting gang crime before it occurs. This will be accomplished by coordinating with cross-sector partners and diminishing the frequency of gang member congregations in public places through a streamlined law enforcement/prosecution partnership; 2) Provide opportunities for emerging young adult gang members to interact with positive faith-based adult role models in the community through a prosecution/community-mentoring partnership; 3) Organize and bring together key stakeholders and cross-sector partners in the problem-solving process by enhancing and

cultivating new partnerships with community organizations, and applying proven existing strategies to address street disorder level crime and 4) Strengthen the capacity of neighborhood residents and businesses to prevent street level offenses and gang related crime through regular meetings, presentations and trainings in the community designed to empower them with wide-ranging strategies to revitalize their neighborhood and create lasting change.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE STRATEGIES TO BE USED / IMPLEMENTED:** 1)

Assign a full time prosecutor to work with the Portland Police Bureau's Neighborhood Response Team (NRT) and other cross-sector partners; 2) Aggressively investigate, prosecute, and apply special probation conditions to livability crimes affecting the Albina target neighborhood, which will in turn deter violent street crime and disorder that creates an environment conducive for gangs; 3) Meet with and educate community members on approaches to address their capacity to prevent and deter crime, including collaborating with and assigning gang members to mentors and assisting them in leaving that lifestyle, 4) Coordinate existing community efforts to reduce street drinking and drug use, and fund the enhancement and expansion of existing community mentorship programs for gang affiliates and at risk youth

**LENGTH OF THE PROJECT PERIOD:** 3 years
