PROCLAMATION

93-112

WHEREAS, every year more than 10,000 American workers
are killed on the job; and

WHEREAS, tens of thousands more are permanently
disabled; and

WHEREAS, millions are injured; and

WHEREAS, another 100,000 workers die from cancer, lung
disease and other diseases related to toxic chemical exposure
at work; and

WHEREAS, concerned Americans are determined to prevent
these tragedies by:


- organizing Workers Memorial Day on April 28, a day
chosen by the unions of the AFL-CIO as a day to
remember these victims of workplace injuries and
disease;
- renewing our efforts to seek stronger safety and
health protections, better standards and enforcement,
and fair and just compensation;
- rededicating ourselves to improving safety and health
in every American workplace.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that April 28 is
Workers Memorial Day in recognition and in honor of workers
killed, injured and disabled on the job.
