**NOTICE OF INTENT to submit an application of up to \$225,000 per year for five years to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's Striving to Reduce Youth Violence Everywhere (STRYVE) Through Local Public Health Leadership grant program.**

**General Information**

**1. What action are you requesting from the Board?**

Authorize the Director of the Health Department to submit an application for up to \$225,000 per year for five years to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's Striving to Reduce Youth Violence Everywhere (STRYVE) through Local Public Health Leadership grant program.

**2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.**

In areas of North and Northeast Portland, youth ages 10-24 experience high rates of violent crime perpetration, violent crime victimization, and injuries and mortality due to violence. Research shows that youth violence can be prevented through addressing community indicators for violent crimes (e.g., poverty, low academic achievement, low school engagement, etc.) through strategies involving multiple sectors of the community. The purpose of the STRYVE grant program is to assist public health departments in leading a multi-sector coalition to prevent youth violence using STRYVE tools within high-risk communities like North and Northeast Portland.

STRYVE is a national initiative led by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to prevent youth violence before it starts. STRYVE's vision is safe and healthy youth who can achieve their full potential as connected and contributing members of thriving, violence-free families, schools, and communities. Projects funded by the STRYVE program will be comprehensive (involving policy, programs, and practices) and will span at least two levels of the socio-ecologic model of health (individual, relationship, community, and societal). STRYVE is evidence-based and reflects the latest research on violence prevention.

With STRYVE funding, the Multnomah County Health Department Community Capacitation Center will work with the Local Public Safety Coordinating Committee (LPSCC) Youth and Gang Violence Steering Committee and the Tri-County Health Officer to implement youth violence prevention in North and Northeast Portland. The partners will engage in two phases over the five-year project period: Phase 1 (years 1 and 2) will include coalition development, strategic planning, resource identification, and capacity assessment; and Phase 2 (years 3-5) will include the implementation and evaluation of the strategic plan developed during Phase 1.

**3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).**

This grant will provide the Multnomah County Health Department's Community Capacitation Center with up to \$225,000 per year for five years to work with the LPSCC Youth and Gang Violence Steering Committee to plan and implement strategies to prevent youth violence in North and Northeast Portland.

**4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.**

None.

**5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.**

The Health Department has worked with the Department of Community Justice, the Chair's Office, and Tri-County Health Officer to develop the application. If funded, the project will be tied to the LPSCC Youth and Gang Violence Steering Committee, as well as appropriate community-based organizations, to assure that the prevention work conducted as part of this grant articulates effectively with current prevention, intervention and suppression activities conducted by our County partners.

The purpose of this grant is to increase the use of comprehensive youth violence prevention strategies that are based on the best available evidence within high-risk communities in North and Northeast Portland.

Cost sharing/matching is not required. Annual reports and financial status reports are due at the end of each 12 month budget period, and final performance and financial status reports are due at the end of the five-year project period.

- **Explain grant funding detail – is this a one time only or long term commitment?**  
The grant will provide the Health Department with up to \$225,000 each year for five years.
- **What are the estimated filing timelines?**  
The application is due June 13, 2011.
- **If a grant, what period does the grant cover?**  
The grant covers the five year period of approximately October 2011 through September 2016.
- **When the grant expires, what are funding plans?**  
Other funding sources, such as grants, will be sought. A requirement of the grant is to identify at least one potential funding mechanism designated to sustain or expand violence prevention activities.
- **Is 100% of the central and departmental indirect recovered? If not, please explain why.**  
All indirect costs associated with the project will be covered with grant funds.
