RESOLUTION NO. 00-082

Approving Multnomah County School District No. 1J and Multnomah County, Oregon Intergovernmental Agreement 0010871 for Fleet Services and Authorizing the County Chair to Execute Documents Necessary to Enter Into and Perform the Intergovernmental Agreement

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. Multnomah County can effectively and economically provide motor vehicle fleet management and maintenance services to Multnomah County School District No. 1J.
- b. Multnomah County School District No. 1J will benefit from increased fleet management and fleet maintenance economies of scale resulting from the contracting for fleet maintenance and management services from the County.
- c. The County will benefit from the use of the existing Multnomah County School District No. 1J Blanchard Education Center's maintenance facility which is located closer to many of the County's vehicles than existing County maintenance facilities.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:


1. Multnomah County shall enter into the Multnomah County School District No. 1J and Multnomah County, Oregon Intergovernmental Agreement 0010871 for Fleet Services before the Board this date.
2. The County Chair is authorized and directed to execute the Multnomah County School District No. 1J and Multnomah County, Oregon Intergovernmental Agreement 0010871 for Fleet Services and any other documents required for completion of said agreement.



FLEET AGREEMENT

MULTNOMAH COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 1J AND MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT- FLEET SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT entered into in accordance with ORS Chapter 190 this 8 day of June, 2000, between Multnomah County, a home rule subdivision of the State of Oregon, hereinafter referred to as "County" and Multnomah School District No. 1J, hereinafter referred to as "District."

1 BACKGROUND AND INTENT

1.1 In September, 1999, County and District signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the intent to enter into a long term agreement for the use and occupancy of a part of the District's Blanchard Education Center by the County and for the County to manage and maintain District's motor vehicle fleet. This Agreement sets forth the terms upon which County will manage and maintain District's motor vehicle fleet and the terms for transfer from District to County of the shop equipment and parts inventory used for maintenance of District's motor vehicles.

1.2 By separate agreement entered into contemporaneously with this agreement, District and County have agreed to the terms of a 99-year lease of approximately 38,907 square feet in the Blanchard Education Center and 7,400 square feet of fleet shop and garage together with additional area for a fleet repair staging area, south loading docks, gasoline fuel pumps and employee and fleet parking, to be used for County administrative offices, shop uses and other municipal functions.

2 TERM

2.1 This Agreement shall begin on July 1, 2000 and shall continue until terminated by mutual agreement of the parties or pursuant to Paragraph 8.

3 DEFINITIONS

3.1 As used in this Agreement, the following terms have the following meaning:

3.1.1 "Equipment" means the equipment listed on Exhibit A.

3.1.2 "Inventory" means the parts inventory to be transferred by District to County as determined under paragraph 4.2.

TRANSFER OF EQUIPMENT AND INVENTORY

4.1 Effective July 1, 2000, District transfers all its right, title, and interest in the Equipment to County. On or before July 1, 2000, County shall pay District as allocated under Paragraph 6.1 of the Real Property Agreement the sum of \$ 82,005 representing the agreed value of the Equipment. County shall have the right to possession of the Equipment on and after July 1, 2000. County accepts the equipment AS IS, WHERE IS.

4.2 Effective July 1, 2000, District transfers all its right, title, and interest in the Inventory to County together with the District's supply of fuel on hand as of July 1, 2000. On or before July 1, 2000, County shall pay District as allocated under Paragraph 6.1 of the Real Property Agreement for the Inventory a sum to be determined as follows which shall be the agreed value of the Inventory:

4.2.1 A physical inventory shall be jointly completed by the parties during the week of June 25, 2000;

4.2.2 Only those parts that can be used on existing District vehicles and which have been purchased by District within 18 months of the inventory date will be included in the inventory to be sold unless the County in its sole discretion otherwise agrees. All other parts may be disposed of by District by September 1, 2000, and District shall be entitled to all proceeds thereof. Any parts that have not been disposed of by that date will become the property of the County.

4.2.3 The value of the items in the inventory shall be determined by District's cost to purchase the parts; if the inventory includes more than one of any particular part, the value of those parts shall be determined by the District's average cost to purchase those parts.

4.2.4 County accepts the Inventory AS IS, WHERE IS. County shall have the right to possession of the Inventory on and after July 1, 2000.

4.3 On July 10, 2000, the parties shall determine the amount to be allocated under Paragraph 6.1 of the Real Property Agreement for the fuel on hand as of July 1, 2000. The amount shall be determined based on District's cost per gallon for its most recent fuel purchase prior to July 1, 2000.

4.4 With respect to the Equipment and Inventory, District hereby disclaims all warranties, both express and implied, including the warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.

FLEET SERVICES

5.1 Beginning as of July 1, 2000, County will provide the services described in Exhibit B on all District owned motor vehicles except school busses. The rates to be charged for such services shall be those charged to non-General Fund County Departments. The parties agree that these charges shall include those described on Exhibit B. The current Multnomah County and Portland Public School District No. 1J IGA. Page 2 of 11

schedule of rates is shown on Exhibit B. The schedule of services and rates shall remain in effect unless changed under paragraph 5.2.

5.2 If County proposes to change the services to be provided or the rates to be charged, then on or before May 1 of each year County will provide District with notice thereof and a schedule of proposed services and rates for the following fiscal year. The proposed rates shall not be more than those to be charged to non-General Fund County Departments. The rates in the schedule shall be the effective rates for the following fiscal year unless within 30 days of the date of County's notice the District gives written notice to the County that the District does not agree to pay the proposed rates. Upon such notice the parties will meet and agree on the rates. If no agreement is reached within 60 days of County's notice to District setting out the schedule of proposed rates, either party may refer the matter for dispute resolution in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 10 of this Agreement. The new schedule agreed to by the parties under this paragraph or set by the arbitrator shall be substituted for Exhibit B to be effective as of July 1 of the next fiscal year.

5.3 The District owned vehicles that will be subject to this Agreement as of July 1, 2000 are shown on Exhibit C.

5.4 District, at District cost, shall input data required by County into County's Fleet Management System concerning each District vehicle identified on Exhibit D on or before July 1, 2000. County shall provide District with training and allow access over the internet to County's Fleet Management System database and software to allow District to input data over the internet from District's offices.

5.5 County may provide the services described in paragraph 5.1 at any County facility and may subcontract such work to commercial repair shops as may in the discretion of the County be necessary or appropriate.

5.6 County will manage the Blanchard Center fuel system and may, at County's expense, convert the existing fuel management system at the Blanchard Center to a system compatible with those at other County facilities. All costs related to new access cards, keys or other media shall be billed to District in the same manner and amounts that such costs are billed to County non-General Fund Departments.

5.7 In performing the services under this Agreement, County shall have the use of the fuel tank, and associated piping and pumps at the Blanchard Center which shall remain the property of District. District shall maintain such items in good repair and operating condition at all times, shall obtain and maintain in effect all permits required for such items and shall comply with all laws and regulations relating to the installation and maintenance of such items. In the event that District shall fail to maintain such items in good repair, County may, after 10 days' prior written notice to District (or 24-hour notice in the case of an emergency), perform the required maintenance and repair and charge the cost to District. County shall use due care and shall operate such items in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations.

5.8 Every month County will provide to District a bill describing the services performed under Paragraph 5 and the charges for such services. District will pay the bill within 30 days of receipt.

6

TRANSFER OF EMPLOYEES

6.1 Effective July 1, 2000, District will transfer to County three employees with a District job classification as "Mechanic" and one employee with a job classification as "Foreman."

6.2 Transferred employees classified as "Mechanics" by District shall be treated as follows:

6.2.1 The job classification for such employees at the County shall be "Equipment Mechanic 2."

6.2.2 The wage rate for each such employee at County as of July 1, 2000, shall be rate paid to such employee by District on June 30, 2000, adjusted downward by an amount equal to the County paid employee contribution to the Public Employee Retirement System (PERS). The reason for the adjustment is that County pays its employees' contribution to PERS but District does not.

6.2.3 The wage rate for each such employee shall be the amount specified in paragraph 6.2.2 until June 30, 2003, or until such wage rate is equal to or less than the then-current County pay scale for Equipment Mechanic 2 based upon the employee's combined years of service to District and County, whichever comes first. As used in this paragraph 6, "combined years of service to District and County" means years of service in the County job classification plus years of service at the District in a comparable job classification. If on June 30, 2003, the County wage rate for Equipment Mechanic 2 positions remains less than the amount specified in paragraph 6.2.2, the employees will be paid such County wage rate, effective July 1, 2003.

6.3 The transferred employee classified as "Foreman" by District shall be treated as follows:

6.3.1 The job classification for such employee at the County shall be "Fleet Maintenance Supervisor" which is a non-represented position.

6.3.2 The wage rate for such employee on and after July 1, 2000 shall be the rate paid to such employee by the District on June 30, 2000, adjusted downward by an amount equal to the County paid employee contribution to PERS and subject to consideration for annual adjustments upward based on County wage increases for comparable County positions. County will in addition pay such employee's contribution to PERS as County does for all County employees.

6.4 Accrued leave banks for each transferring employee will be treated as follows:

6.4.1 Each transferring employee may transfer to County the maximum number of hours of accrued vacation leave that the transferred employee is permitted to accrue in his position as a County employee. Each transferred employee may transfer to the County all accrued sick leave. No compensatory leave, personal leave or other leave may be transferred. District shall be responsible for any obligations which may exist with respect to accrued compensatory leave or personal leave of transferring employees.

6.4.2 District shall pay to County the following sums:

6.4.2.1 A sum equal to 50% of the total number of sick leave hours transferred by each transferring employee times the hourly rate of such employee on June 30, 2000.

6.4.2.2 A sum equal to 100% of the total vacation leave hours transferred by each transferring employee times the hourly rate of such employee on June 30, 2000.

6.4.2.3 The sums specified in paragraphs 6.4.2.1 and 6.4.2.2 shall be paid on or before July 1, 2000.

6.5. For the period from July 1, 2000, until June 30, 2003, or until the wage rate specified in paragraph 6.2.2 is equal to or less than the then-current County pay scale for Equipment Mechanic 2 based upon the employee's combined years of service to District and County, whichever comes first, the District will pay County the following:

6.5.1 The difference between the following:

6.5.1.1 The amount specified in paragraph 6.2.2 times the actual number of hours paid to such employees transferred into the position of Equipment Mechanic 2, and,

6.5.1.2 The wage the employee would have earned at the then-current County wage rate for Equipment Mechanic 2 times the actual number of hours paid to such employees transferred into the position of Equipment Mechanic 2.

6.5.2 Such sum(s) shall be paid annually on or before August 1 of each calendar year, provided County submits to District an invoice for such sums by July 1 of each calendar year.

6.6 All transferring employees shall be entitled to coverage under County health insurance plans without any waiting period for preexisting conditions. District shall for a period of 12 months reimburse County for any additional premium costs incurred by County resulting from the waiver of any waiting period.

6.7 This Agreement is not intended to benefit any individual, employee, group of employees, corporation, or other legal entity other than County and District. This Agreement shall not be deemed to vest any rights in, nor shall it be deemed to be enforceable by, any third party in any proceeding whatsoever.

6.8 All transferring employees shall have seniority determined as follows: Where County uses years of service in a job classification for any purpose, seniority shall be determined by years of service in the County job classification plus years of service at the District in a comparable job classification. Where County uses total years of service with the County for any purpose, seniority shall be determined by total years of service with the County plus total years of service with the District.

6.9 Any transferred employee who has had a compensable injury under the Worker's Compensation Laws of Oregon while an employee of District who is not released to full duty on the effective date of the transfer shall not be transferred to County until released to full duty. Until such time as the injured employee is released to full duty, the District shall retain all obligation for re-employment and reinstatement under ORS 659.415 to ORS 659.420, and all obligation for group health benefits. District shall reimburse County for any costs incurred by County for benefits paid, retraining and any other costs associated with any claim by transferred employee that the employee, while employed by the County, suffered an injury which is an aggravation of a compensable injury which occurred while a transferred employee was employed by District.

TERMINATION, DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

7.1 Either party may terminate this Agreement effective July 1 of any year by notice of termination in writing to the other party not later than January 1 of the year in which the termination is to be effective. The parties agree not to terminate this Agreement under this paragraph prior to July 1, 2003. If District terminates the agreement then District shall repurchase from County all parts inventory that County is unable to use for its continuing service and repair work for itself and others. The value of the inventory to be repurchased shall be determined in the manner provided in paragraph 4.2.

7.2 If County shall fail to pay any of the sums required to be paid under this Agreement or fail to perform the services required to be performed by County under this Agreement, County shall be deemed to be in default. If District shall fail to pay any of the sums required to be paid under this Agreement or fail to do any other thing required to be done by District under this Agreement, District shall be deemed to be in default.

7.3 If County, after written notice, fails to pay any of the sums required to be paid under this Agreement or to remedy any other default within 60 days, or if the remedy requires more than 60 days, fails to begin and diligently pursue remedy of the default within 60 days, the District may, at its option, terminate this Agreement by giving written notice of such termination to County. District may also pursue any other remedies available to it under applicable law by reason of County's default.

7.4 If District, after written notice, fails to pay any of the sums required to be paid under this Agreement or to remedy any other default within 60 days, or if the remedy requires more than 60 days, fails to begin and diligently pursue remedy of the default within 60 days, County may, at its option, terminate this Agreement immediately by giving written notice of such termination to District. County may also pursue any other remedies available to it under applicable law by reason of District's default.

8 INSURANCE

8.1 It is understood that District and County are both self-insured public bodies in the State of Oregon. If either party ceases to be self-insured, such party shall so notify the other party's risk manager in writing as soon as is practicable. In that event, the party ceasing to be self-insured ("Insuring Party") shall maintain worker's compensation insurance as required by statutes, general commercial liability insurance, property damage insurance and automobile liability insurance with respect to its activities under this Agreement. The insurance shall name the other party ("Insured Party") and its officials and employees as additional insureds.

8.2 Except as may be required by Section 8.3, the insurance referred to in Section 8.1 shall provide liability coverage for not less than \$200,000 for personal injury to each person, \$500,000 for each occurrence, and \$50,000 for occurrences involving property damage.

8.3 The limits of the required insurance shall be changed by a percentage equal to the percentage of any change in the maximum limit of liability imposed on political subdivisions of the State of Oregon during the term of this Agreement.

8.4 The insurance shall be without prejudice to coverage otherwise existing and shall name as additional insureds the Insured Party and its officers, agents, and employees. Notwithstanding the naming of additional insured, the insurance shall protect each insured in the same manner as though a separate policy had been issued with the Insured Party named as insured. The coverage must apply as to claims between insureds on the policy.

8.5 The insurance shall provide that the coverage shall not terminate or be canceled without sixty (60) days written notice first being given to the Insured Party's risk manager. If the insurance is canceled or terminated prior to termination of the Agreement, the Insuring Party shall provide a new policy with the same or greater limits. The Insuring Party agrees to maintain continuous, uninterrupted coverage for the duration of the Agreement and to provide the Insured Party with evidence thereof.

8.6 County will be liable for and repair all damage to District vehicles while in the control of the County unless such damages is the result of negligence of the District. If the cost of repair of any such damage exceeds the value of the vehicle, County may elect to pay District the fair market value of the vehicle in lieu of making repair.

8.7 8.7 When County subcontracts work on District vehicles, County will require the subcontractor to maintain Garagekeepers Legal Liability insurance or Commercial General Liability insurance together with Commercial Automobile Insurance. The combined single limit for such insurance shall be not less than \$500,000.

9 INDEMNIFICATION

9.1 Subject to the limits in the Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.265 *et seq.* and the Oregon Constitution, District agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless County, its officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, actions and liabilities, and all expenses incidental to the investigation and defense thereof, arising out of or as a result of damage or injuries (including death) to persons or property in connection with District's performance or failure to perform under this Agreement.

9.2 Subject to the limits in the Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.265 *et seq.* and the Oregon Constitution, County agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless District, its officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, actions and liabilities, and all expenses incidental to the investigation and defense thereof, arising out of or as a result of damage or injuries (including death) to persons or property in connection with County's performance or failure to perform under this Agreement.

10 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

10.1 In the event a dispute arises concerning this Agreement, the County and the District agree that the dispute shall initially be submitted to mediation. The mediator will be selected by mutual agreement, and will be compensated equally by both parties. If the parties fail to agree on a mediator within ten days of notice by either party of a request for mediation, a mediator shall be appointed by the presiding judge of the Multnomah County Circuit Court upon the request of either party.

10.2 The parties agree that any dispute under this Agreement which is not resolved through mediation under Section 10.1 shall be resolved in accordance with this section. An arbitrator will be selected by mutual agreement, and will be compensated equally by both parties. If the parties fail to agree on an arbitrator within ten days of notice by either party of a request for arbitration, each party shall submit to the presiding judge of the Multnomah County Circuit Court a list of three proposed arbitrators and the presiding judge shall appoint an arbitrator from among those proposed. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorney fees in connection with any arbitration.

11 MISCELLANEOUS

11.1 No waiver of any breach of any covenant, term, or condition of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing. No waiver of any breach shall be a waiver of any other breach.

11.2 This Agreement may be modified only by a writing signed for County by the Chair or the Chair's designee, who is as of the date of this agreement the County Director of Environmental Services, and signed for District by the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee who is as of the date of this agreement the District Facility and Asset Manager. The parties shall not be bound by any oral or written statement of any servant, agent, or employee purporting to modify this Agreement.

11.3 Neither County nor District shall be deemed in default for the nonperformance or for any interruption or delay in performance of any of the terms, covenants, and conditions of this Agreement if due to any labor dispute, strike, lockout, civil commotion, or like operation, invasion, rebellion, hostilities, military or usurped power, sabotage, governmental regulations or controls, legal injunction, inability to obtain labor, services or materials, or act of God or other cause beyond the reasonable control of County or District, respectively.

11.4 All exhibits which are referenced to in this Agreement, are attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein.

11.5 Notice between the parties shall be in writing, effective when personally delivered to the recipient's address specified below or, if mailed, effective forty-eight (48) hours following mailing, postage prepaid, to the recipient's address specified below or such address as wither party may specify by notice to the other:







The County will provide a full range of fleet maintenance and management services for the District in generally the same manner as provided to County Departments. The rates shown below are for the 2000/01 fiscal year.
