Portland Building to Justice Center Conduit System

Amendment 3

This Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) was entered into effective September 25, 2000, between the City of Portland (City) and Multnomah County (County) to share and jointly own existing conduits to connect the Justice Center, the Portland Building and the downtown Multnomah County Courthouse (the IGA). The Portland City Council approved this IGA in July, 2000, Ordinance No. 174677, Contract No. 51376. The Multnomah County Commission approved this IGA in August, 2000, Contract No. 0110833.

This IGA authorizes the County and the City project managers, respectively, to agree and execute Amendments, except to the extent that the amendment would cause compensation to be paid by either Party to the other.

In December, 2002, the County and the City executed Amendment 1, expanding the scope of this IGA to include sharing conduit and fiber along the Hawthorne Bridge System.

In June, 2010, the County and the City executed Amendment 2, extending the term of the IGA through June 30, 2020.

The purpose of this Amendment is to expand the scope of the IGA to include sharing conduit and fiber within the Sellwood Bridge system, and sharing existing fibers within a fiber cable owned by the City and connecting to the Hawthorne Bridge System.

The County and the City hereby agree to amend the IGA as follows:

In Section 3, "Description of the Systems," the existing subsections relating to the "Portland Building to Justice Center Conduit System" and the "Hawthorne Bridge System" are further identified and captioned by the addition of the letters "A" and "B" respectively; and following the newly captioned subsection "3.B. Hawthorne Bridge System," a new subsection captioned "C. Sellwood Bridge System" is added as follows:

- C. Sellwood Bridge System. The County will provide space for the City to place fiber across the Sellwood Bridge System from the east end intersection of Springwater Trail and Spokane Avenue to a utility vault at the west end intersection of Macadam Avenue and the new Sellwood Bridge. The utility vault will be set to intercept conduit running from Macadam Avenue and SW Nebraska Street to the west end of the new Sellwood Bridge. The City will place fiber from the east end

intersection of the Springwater Trail and Spokane Avenue to the west end intersection of Macadam Avenue and SW Nebraska Street, and terminate that fiber at each end to fiber management panels.. The County will also place County fiber over the bridge separately and terminate their fiber optic cable at the same patch panel locations. The County and the City will place a cabinet at each end to house these management panels. The panel at the west end will intercept the existing City-owned fiber cable along the Macadam Avenue route.

The City will provide the County with four unlit fibers from the Sellwood Bridge west end patch panel to the room at the west end of the Hawthorne Bridge. The City will reserve two additional fibers on this same route for the County for restoration purposes if needed.

All other terms and conditions of this IGA and Amendments 1 and 2 shall remain the same and in effect, except to the extent changed by this Amendment 3.
