Dear Chair Cogen, Commissioner Kafoury, Commissioner Smith, Commissioner Shiprack
and Commissioner McKeel:

We are faith leaders supporting the adoption of the resolution promoting public safety and against the mandatory implementation of Secure Communities before you today. As faith leaders, we are very concerned about the impact the Federal "Secure" Communities program has on our community. Central to all faith traditions are the principles of the common good, human dignity and love for one's neighbor. In many of our sacred texts the value of welcoming the stranger is an explicit mandate and primary tenet of our faith.

The joining of forces of the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and local law enforcement does the opposite of securing our community. As a result of this program, the trust between local law enforcement and immigrants is grossly eroded. Secure Communities allows ICE to identify, process, and remove immigrants incarcerated in our local jails. This leads to further criminalization of migrants where minor violations, often traffic stops, turn into an investigation of citizenship status. Furthermore, low-priority non-violent offenders or even citizens are being funneled into this program and face deportation, needlessly separating thousands of families. The implementation of Secure Communities wastes our scarce public resources that could be used to make our communities safer.

Our faith now calls us to be part of changing this unjust policy. The resolution before you today is an important first step in making our community welcoming to all people and a supporting community that values family unity and fairness. We hope you will support other measures that will ensure that all people are treated fairly and with dignity. We believe that you should consider adopting actions that have been taken by other communities, including Santa Clara County and Cook County, to ensure that our jails do not honor the optional detainer requests made by ICE based on nationality. We cannot build a strong community if our community continues to be unnecessarily torn apart.

Dear Chairman Cogan and the Commissioners of Multnomah County

Thank you for your time while reading this letter. The Rural Organizing Project is a statewide, non-partisan, non-profit organization that has devoted nearly twenty years toward promoting democracy, social justice, economic justice, and human dignity for all. We have a membership of 50 rural human dignity groups across rural and small town Oregon, over 10,000 households and are members of the ACT for Justice and Dignity Network.

Rural Organizing Project opposes programs like Secure Communities because it does the opposite of what its name implies. It has broken up approximately 88,000 families with spouses and children who are US citizens across the country. It makes our communities less secure by creating a climate where people refrain from reporting crimes or helping local law enforcement because of their ties with ICE. Secure Communities claims to focus on "prioritizing the removal of individuals who present the most significant threats to public safety as determined by the severity of their crime, their criminal history, and other factors" but according to a study done by the Chief Justice Warren Institute on Law and Social Policy only 8% of those detained through secure communities were convicted of aggravated felonies. 45% of those detained were solely charged with Present Without Admission (PWA) and did not have a criminal record. Given the current state of our economy, the estimated \$12,500 per deportation that ICE Director Kumar Kibble quoted January 2011 could have been spent somewhere else to create a positive impact in the communities we live in.

The Multnomah County resolution calling for ICE to honor its own memorandums on prosecutorial discretion is a real step toward actually securing Oregon's communities. The Rural Organizing Project supports your decision to stand to uphold the dignity of the undocumented friends, family, and neighbors that help make the county what it is today. We look forward to seeing your continued support and efforts on this issue to make Oregon a more secure and welcoming place to call home.

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**Testimony in Support of the Multnomah County, Oregon Resolution Calling Upon
US Immigration and Customs Enforcement to Exercise Prosecutorial Discretion
Regarding Implementation of the “Secure Communities Program”**

Chair Cogen, Commissioner Kafoury, Commissioner Smith, Commissioner Shiprack,
and Commissioner McKeel:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of your efforts to protect members of
our community from improper, inappropriate, and unlawful detention and deportation.

Thank you for reminding us that enforcement of federal civil immigration law is the
responsibility of the federal government and not of State, County, and/or City
governments, and that routine adherence to protocols developed to facilitate detention
and deportation of our neighbors – without thoughtful case-by case attention to context
and details – constitutes assaults on the lives of people and their children, on community
safety, on civil rights, on access to due process, and on our democracy itself.

As a pediatrician who has lived and worked in Multnomah County since 1965, I care
especially about the well-being of our children. You who have worked so devotedly, year
after year, to protect families in distress know full well that immigrant and refugee
victims and survivors of domestic violence who are terrified of the prospect of
deportation of the abuser on whom they are economically dependent, or of themselves,
are likely to be reluctant to seek help no matter how desperately needed. Further, there is
abundant evidence that parental separation due to incarceration is itself an adverse
childhood experience that, especially when combined with such other family problems as
abuse or neglect, creates or increases the risk of severe developmental problems in the
childhood years; psychological, social, and behavioral problems in the teenage years; and
serious chronic medical problems in the adult years. (Please see documentation below.)

Let’s keep working together to protect our children from harm, and to make life better for
everyone who lives, works, studies, worships, or travels in Multnomah County.
