ABOUT THIS SURVEY:

Perhaps the greatest concern of the LGBT community is housing and the need to find housing where we will be welcomed as a LGBT person. This concern grows as we age. Over the past year, Friendly House staff and volunteers worked with housing providers to develop a survey tool to rate how LGBT friendly housing providers are in Oregon.

We want to acknowledge all participants in this guide no matter their score. By agreeing to participate, each housing community has demonstrated its commitment to creating more inclusive housing options for LGBT older adults. We thank them all for their commitment to the LGBT community and for being part of this innovative project.

Who is rated? This is a consumer guide for a broad range of senior living, including multiple levels of care, cost, location and amenities. All housing providers participated voluntarily.

How the rating is created? The survey that housing providers completed includes questions on employee equality, resident rights, outreach to the LGBT community, staff trainings and agency policies. This survey was created only to assess LGBT welcoming environments. Amenities and factors unrelated to this specific goal were neither evaluated nor considered.

SAGE Metro Portland is a program of Friendly House, is dedicated to improving the lives of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender older adults. We offer trainings for aging service providers, host social events for LGBT older adults, advocate for LGBT friendly housing options, and connect LGBT older adults to supportive services.
