The Multnomah County Department of Community Justice (DCJ), provides services to youth and adults on supervision in Multnomah County.

In preparation for the FY14 County Budget process, the Board of County Commissioners is providing opportunities for each department to provide an informational briefing. In this session, DCJ will provide an update on Gang Suppression efforts within Multnomah County. The update will highlight successes and collaborative efforts to address prevention, intervention and suppression of gang involvement and gang violence in the community. DCJ will address the need for continued support and development of programs which target gang prevention, intervention and suppression efforts in the community in collaboration with criminal justice partners, stakeholders and the community.

OTO funding -Program Offers: #50056 – Community Partner Reinvestment Program offers outreach to those transitioning out of local jails (\$175K), and #50037A – This program offer discontinues a contract to provide skill-building and employment services to gang-involved offenders which expires June 30, 2013.
