General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

We are requesting approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) #30898 with the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT).

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

The original IGA with ODOT (ODOT Contract #29856) for this Sandy Boulevard Project (Project) states that ODOT will award the contract under the ODOT procurement program. This new IGA#30898 changes the delivery method of the Project to have Multnomah County award the contract under the County procurement rules and the Certification program. The Transportation Division anticipates this change in method will save time, and the goal is to have the Project underway by the Summer of 2016. IGA #30898 completely supersedes and replaces IGA #29856, and IGA #29856 is terminated upon the execution of this new IGA.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

The total cost of the Project is estimated at \$1,375,775. STP urban funds will provide \$659,000 of this amount. The balance will be provided from the County road fund and are available in the Transportation budget.
