WHEREAS, 41 percent of the inmates in Oregon's state correctional facilities function below an 8th grade level in reading and 87 percent function below an 8th grade level in mathematics; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Corrections has found that those under parole/probation supervision who have an 8th grade education or less are much less likely to find full-time employment than those with a high school education; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of the Multnomah County Department of Community Corrections to promote the positive change of offenders in the community through integrated rehabilitative strategies; and


WHEREAS, the Honorable Donald H. Londer, Presiding Judge of the Circuit Court of Oregon, has been a staunch advocate of both sanctions and programs which enhance the likelihood of positive change in the lives of those brought before his bench; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Donald H. Londer has been a strong ally of the Department's efforts to promote among offenders the basic skills of reading, writing and mathematics; the thinking skills required to create, reason, and solve problems; and such personal qualities as integrity, responsibility, sociability, self-management and self-esteem;

Now, Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that the new computer-assisted learning center operated by the Department of Community Corrections shall bear the name "The Donald H. Londer Center for Learning."
