General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Update of Fees and Charges for Chapter 15, Sheriff, of the Multnomah County Code and Repealing Resolution No. 2013-015 to incorporate revisions made in the Oregon Revised Statutes Section 21.300 "Sheriff and process server fees" for the recovery of actual costs.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer(s) this action affects and how it impacts the results.

This resolution updates the Civil Process section of the MCC Chapter 15 Sheriff fees to comply with changes made in ORS 21.300, which has been recently updated by the Oregon Legislature. These fee adjustments are to cover the actual cost involved with the legal notice process, the sale of real and personal property, as well as the cost involved for archive record requests, standard file searches and custom file searches.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

Chapter 15, Sheriff, of the Multnomah County Code provides that the Board shall establish certain fees and charges by resolution. These changes will increase the revenue received from Sheriff's Office fees in the general fund.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

ORS 21.300 has been revised by HB 2618, which has been signed by the Governor Brown.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

The Oregon State Legislature held hearings and passed HB 2618. The measure has been enacted by the Governor.
