ORDINANCE NO. 752

An ordinance to amend Ordinance 738 modifying the membership for the Advisory Committee on Animal Control Policies and Procedures.

(Language in brackets [ ] is to be deleted; underlined language is new)

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

SECTION I. AMENDMENT OF SECTION II(A)(1).

(1) The Advisory Committee shall consist of [11] 14 representatives from the following areas:

Positions 1, 2, [and] 3, 4, 5, and 6. [Three members from city governments in the County. One from Portland, one from Gresham, and one representing the remaining small cities.] One representative from each of the six city governments in the County.

Position [4] 7. One member from the Oregon Humane Society.

Position [5] 8. One member from a non-profit organization interested in animal welfare.

Positions [6 and 7] 9 and 10. Two members who are interested citizens - representatives from neighborhood and/or

citizen involvement organizations. At least one citizen member must be a member of the Multnomah County Citizen Involvement Committee.

Position [8] 11. One member from the Veterinarian community.

Position [9] 12. One member from the pet industry in the County.

Position [10] 13. One member who is a volunteer Hearings Officer involved in Animal Control activities.

Position [11] 14. One member who is from Board staff (liaison to Board).

SECTION II. AMENDMENT OF SECTION II(C)(2).

(2) To ensure rotating terms, the following terms shall apply to all initial appointments to the Advisory Committee:

Positions 1, [4, 7, and 9] 4, 7, 10, and 12 shall serve three year terms.

Positions 3, [6, and 10] 5, 9, and 13 shall serve two year


