This briefing will focus on two multi-agency research projects addressing the intersections between the mental health system and the public safety system. The outcomes of these projects are greater system wide understanding, improved human outcomes and budgetary efficiencies.

The Local Public Safety Coordinating Council and multiple stakeholders in Multnomah

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County requested the Sequential intercept mapping and Taking Action for Change workshops provided Policy Research Associates at the National GAINS Center. These workshops produced the final report titled Transforming Services for Persons with Mental Illness in Contact with the Criminal Justice System.

The second focus of this briefing is the Safer PDX project. Portland is one of five sites chosen nationally by the Bazelon Center for Mental Health Law. A team led by William Nunley MD and Cascadia Behavioral Health is identifying data sources and information strengths and weakness within the mental health – criminal justice interface. This research is being conducted through root cause analyses methodology.
