Why it's important to have Mission, Vision, and Values Clarity

“Promote an atmosphere where the direction is clear and where you can translate the vision into action in an environment where people are accountable.”

Joel Kurtzman: Common Purpose

Vision Statements, Mission Statements and Values

Definitions:

Vision: The desired or preferred future in terms of its fundamental direction.

“What do we want?” The Vision is aspirational and inspiring.

Mission: The fundamental purpose of an organization, succinctly describing why it exists and what it does to achieve its Vision. “What do we do? How do we do it? How are we unique?”

Values: Beliefs that are shared among the stakeholders of an organization. Values drive an organization's culture and priorities and provide a framework in which decisions are made. “What is most important to remember while doing our work?”

Criteria: Conditions and Limitations

Examples

People. . . .

- won't have to hire . . .we have the people we need to do this
- our people have the skill to do this
- supports health

Time . . .

- can be successfully completed quickly
- won't have a negative impact on schedules
- is sustainable over time

Political Impact

- will be supported by constituents
- represents good stewardship of the public resources
- is within regulatory and charter constraints
- lets us achieve our goals

Cultural Impact

- is equitable
- demonstrates integrity
- supports social justice
- moves us towards economic security
- uses a collaborative approach, involves the community

Organization Climate

- will improve morale
- will improve communication in the organization
- will improve effectiveness
- will not require capital expenditures
- will help utilize little used space/equipment
- will improve service
- will be seen as positive by Stakeholders
- uses creative thinking

Mission Ideas (Electeds):

- We use our resources to take care of the most vulnerable citizens
- We care for people no one else does
- Deliver core services (need to be better defined)
- Provide leadership for our departments and for our communities – the naughty and the needy
- Make Multnomah County a good place for the people who live here

Vision ideas (Electeds):

- The Sellwood Bridge will be completed
- People will understand the relationship between early childhood education and crime prevention
- People are engaged in the community from cradle to grave
- Kids and adults can walk home safely through a neighborhood of concern
- This is a beloved community where there is true interdependence
- Multnomah County is the gold standard for all Counties for the state of Oregon and beyond.
- The county will be seen as a vital partner
- People will know and understand us – trust us to make decisions based on our mission
- We don't saw off the limb we're on when we prune
- County employees are equipped for the job they're doing
- We're aware of and responsive to what's upstream
- We act from our core values, in addition to constituents' interests
- We budget based on systems of service delivery, not just departments

Mission Ideas (Directors and other local Elected):

- We provide equity in human services in collaboration with the communities we serve
- We manage for results in a fair, efficient, and measurable way with integrity, so people will respect the outcomes
- Our benchmark is the community as a whole. Everyone needs protection, not just the vulnerable
- We do things nobody else is doing for people nobody else takes care of
- We have a problem-solving and education focus
- We strive to integrate services among departments, and government organizations, and the community
- We advocate for customers
- Follow core purpose (needs to be named)
- Perform regulatory responsibilities

Vision Ideas (Directors and other local Electeds):

- We govern and lead in such a way that the community is well served
- There are agreed-upon process for decision making and communicating decisions.
- The community is included in each decision
- People know, and are proud of what their county government provides and want to pay taxes and vote
- Operate with transparency and efficiency; clear about outcomes and expectations
- We're grounded in indicators-- use data and performance to drive decisions
- The county is integrated with a common set of values and context
- Resources are distributed wisely
- Our core values are so strong that people who don't have those values won't apply to work here
- Our work force reflects the communities we work with
- Race is not a predictor of employee success; socially just world
- We demonstrate partnership and respect with communities of faith
- We live within our resources and have a diversified revenue stream
- We're one of the most progressive counties in the nation
- We follow best practices and hire the best people.
- County leverages resources well—fewer “issues du jour”
- We continue to re-interpret what systems we need to deliver service. We're responsive to change. We innovate and take risks
- Citizens feel safe and feel that they belong
- Everyone has access to healthy, sustainable food in neighborhoods
- Our community and our families are healthy
- People are civically engaged and eager to learn
- Sense of place and connected neighborhoods
- Citizens will be able to depend on stable core services day after day, year to year
- We're not just focused on subsistence
- We're not all things to all people
