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Chair Kafoury, Commissioners of Multnomah County,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today in support of Multnomah County's sanctuary resolution. My name is Andrea Williams, Executive Director of Causa. We are a nonprofit organization that has worked to improve the lives of Latino immigrants and their families for over 20 years. We've been a key advocate in Oregon for immigration reform, DACA, Tuition Equity, and driver licenses. Today's resolution is very close to our hearts, and we hope to see more of these efforts to support the county's immigrant community in the future.

I want to first thank you for your efforts to bring this before the commission. It's now more important than ever that Multnomah County lives out its values of equity and inclusion by taking action to support all of its residents, especially immigrant communities.

So many families that Causa works with are living in fear and uncertainty. Trump has promised to end DACA, and deport 2-3 million people who've set down roots, have families, and have contributed so much to the United States. We have no other choice than to take Trump and the people he's appointing for their word.

Despite the harmful ideas the next President will implement, we here in Multnomah County can and must act on a different vision for our local communities. We may not be able to control what the President does, but we can control what our county does to provide opportunity, respect, and safety for our neighbors.

The stakes are high, what we do in this county can set the pace for the rest of the state. Multnomah County is home to the largest immigrant population in Oregon, and also the largest DACA recipient population, and as such, has the responsibility and opportunity of setting an example for the state on policies that integrate and include immigrants.

I see this resolution as an affirmation of Multnomah County's values, and one step of many that we need to take to create a welcoming and inclusive county for all. I'd like to offer Causa and myself as a resource and collaborator to explore additional initiatives the county can implement to ensure that the civil and human rights of all are protected and that immigrant communities continue to have access to services that meet their basic needs.

In fact, we've been working in partnership with other organizations and attorneys to put together policy priorities for cities and counties to consider. Establishing a municipal ID and funding access to legal representation are two priorities we've identified that other local governments have enacted across the nation. We'd appreciate the opportunity to discuss these ideas further.

I look forward to working with you in that endeavor. Thank you for your time.
