RE: DIRECTOR'S CUSTODY DESIGNATION

I. Recommendation/Action Requested:

Ratification of the changes in the list of designees for Director Custody Holds (mental health holds).

II. Background/Analysis:

In 1987 the Board of County Commissioners ratified the participation of Multnomah County in the authority to place Director Custody Holds. ORS 426.215 enables a designee of the Community Mental Health Program Director to cause police to transport an allegedly mentally ill person dangerous to self or others to local hospitals for investigation prior to a possible court hearing for commitment to the state mental health division.

The majority of people placed on a hold by a mental health director designee end up being committed to the state hospital which suggests that this hold is not used indiscriminately when less restrictive, alternative methods can be used to meet the needs of people with mental illness. The Psychiatric Emergency Operations Team, which includes staff from the County, hospitals, law enforcement agencies, and mental health agencies, reviews interorganizational coordination.

In the 1992-93 fiscal year, there were 82 of these holds placed. Which is a significant increase probably resulting in part from centralization of the Involuntary Commitment Program.

III. Financial Impact:

No impact.

IV. Legal Issues:

The rules governing Director Custody Holds are found in ORS 426.233.

V. Controversial Issues:

Process has been in effect since 1987. We see no current political controversy in this matter.

VI. Link to Current County Policies:

This is consistent with current County policies.

VII. Citizen Participation:

We do not anticipate citizen involvement at this meeting.

VIII. Other Government Participation:

There are no other jurisdiction/county departments affected.

RE: Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 792 in order to add, delete, and revise exempt pay ranges.

I. Recommendation/Action Requested: Adoption of Ordinance

II. Background/Analysis: The Board adopted a new exempt employee compensation system, effective July 1, 1991. Since that time, the Personnel Section has kept the system up to date by bringing periodic changes to the Board to adopt. This is the most recent update.

Section II.(A) deletes two classifications that are no longer needed, due to departmental reorganization of responsibilities.

Section II.(B) adds new classifications that have become necessary due to creation of new programs or reorganization of responsibilities. All these classifications, except one, have been previously adopted by the Board by budget modification or other action. This Ordinance adopts salary ranges for these classifications. The exception is Property/Commissary/Laundry Administrator, which is necessary to recognize responsibilities added to a civilian position in the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office will be processing a Budget Modification to reclassify one position to this new class.

Section II.(C) moves the salary range upward one range for the Finance Manager and for the Civil Process Supervisor. At the beginning of 1994, the Civil Process Supervisor requested a review of his position evaluation. That review is now completed, and it is recommended that the pay range be increased to adequately reflect this position's responsibility, particularly in the area of public contact.

The functions in Management Support Services (MSS) were reorganized effective February 14, 1994. The management of the Purchasing Division became part of the Finance Manager's responsibilities. These additional responsibilities result in the recommended pay range increase for this position.

Finally, in this paragraph, these new pay ranges are brought forward to the present time by applying across-the-board increases that have occurred since the recommended effective dates for the two positions.

Section II.(D).1. removes the set pay range for Chief Deputy District Attorney and allows the District Attorney to administer the pay for this classification as is done for most other appointed staff that report directly to elected officials.

Section II.(D).2. sets the County share of the District Attorney's pay at \$14,032. This is a \$3,000 annual increase over the current pay of \$11,032. The County share of the District Attorney pay has not been changed since the early 1980's. As explained in a separate memo from Kelly Bacon of the DA's Office, the total pay for Multnomah County's District Attorney is less than that of four other large Oregon counties. The District Attorney also is compensated less than some of his subordinate staff. This recommendation brings the pay range more in line with other counties, but does not fully resolve the problem of internal relationships within the DA's Office.

Section III specifies that employees in classifications with ranges that have been revised are reclassified and may be eligible for pay increases within the limits of Ordinance 778, Section IX.(A), which is the Board's regular pay administration policy.

Section IV recommends that one employee's pay be increased. There are a number of reasons for the recommended adjustment in the Child & Adolescent Mental Health Manager annual pay to \$57,992. First, over the last few years the Child & Adolescent Mental Health Program has grown in scope and in number of employees. It was primarily School Based Mental Health; it now includes the Youth Program Office, the Partners Project, and a number of other specialized programs with over 60 employees. Second, the incumbent now has a direct reporting relationship to the Director of Community & Family Services, as opposed to other managers within the division who report to the Deputy Director. Third, as shown in the chart below, the incumbent is by far the lowest paid manager in the Division. This increase in pay will not make him the highest paid but will bring him to the level of the next lowest paid manager in the Division.

This proposed Ordinance reflects the most recent work of the Personnel Section to keep the exempt employee compensation system, which was installed in 1991, up to date. The major changes proposed are: (1) Delete classifications no longer needed; (2) Create new classifications (no cost); (3) Change selected salary ranges to reflect increases or decreases in responsibility; and (4) Award special adjustments in order to maintain appropriate internal relationships. The costs associated with the last two items will be absorbed within current budgeted funds. The revision in the Finance Manager range reflects increase in responsibilities for absorbing the Purchasing Division on February 14, 1994. The increase in the Civil Process Supervisor range is the result of a requested review to ensure that the position responsibilities are correctly evaluated.



INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

Between
Multnomah County,
Vocational Rehabilitation Division,
Commission for the Blind

This agreement is between Multnomah County, hereafter called the County; the State of Oregon's Vocational Rehabilitation Division, hereafter called VRD; and the State of Oregon's Commission for the Blind, hereafter called CB.

RECITALS:

1. The mutual objectives of the County, VRD, and CB are as follows: To develop a partnership where County employees will have an opportunity to interact with persons with disabilities in a work setting, and to provide persons with disabilities an opportunity to explore the labor market through contact with County employees.

2. For the purpose of this agreement, the County will recognize and classify our clients as temporary volunteers.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

I. Term

This agreement shall begin January 2, 1995 and end December 31, 1995.

II. Eligibility

Clients of VRD or CB and employees of Multnomah County are eligible for services under this agreement.

III. Length of Time for Temporary Volunteer Experience

The length of time for any work experience is 90 days or less, except for special and/or unusual situations. The extension would be for an additional 90 days, with a written request from the volunteer's manager, and signed off by the volunteer, a representative from the Affirmative Action Office, and VRD and/or the Commission for the Blind. No work experience by any one volunteer shall exceed 180 days.

Each volunteer, the job scope, and category for employment, i.e., job shadowing, on-the-job training, and/or professional skills experience will be evaluated on an individual basis to determine the length of volunteer work experience.

IV. Description of Responsibilities - VRD and CB

Vocational Rehabilitation Division and the Commission for the Blind shall provide the following:

- Screening of all persons with disabilities who are referred by VRD and CB to the County to explore the world of work through contact with County employees.
- Coordination of all necessary and/or required activities and contacts related to this agreement.
- Provide the necessary services and costs to enable persons with disabilities to have direct contact with County employees and the jobs they perform.

- Consultation for County employees who have disabilities which may jeopardize their continued employment.
- Upon request, consultation/evaluation necessary to ensure that County work stations are accessible.
- General accessibility surveys.
- Ensure coverage of Workers' Compensation benefits for job shadowing, unpaid work experiences, community-based evaluations and professional skills training experiences.

Description of Responsibilities - Multnomah County

The County shall provide the following services:

- Informational Interviews for VRD and CB clients.
- Job Shadowing to enable clients to observe specific jobs, duties, and work environments.
- Unpaid Work Experience to allow clients to obtain knowledge and understanding of various jobs through hands-on experience.
- Community-Based Evaluation in real job settings. The County will provide the evaluation site. The Vocational Rehabilitation Division or the Commission for the Blind will either provide this service directly with a professional from their organization or contract with a professional evaluator to facilitate the evaluation. County staff, when appropriate, may be requested to provide feedback and/or input on the person who is being evaluated. There is no cost to the County for this activity.
- Professional Skills Experience site. The County will provide the site and the skill development. Portland Community College, VRD, and CB will provide the necessary cost, i.e., tuition, books, and supplies that may be necessary to complete the skill training. There is no cost to the County in reference to the professional skills training program.

V. Mutual Responsibilities

1. VRD/CB clients from Multnomah, Clackamas, and Washington Counties will be the focus populations.

2. The VRD/CB and the County shall comply with all applicable requirements of federal and state civil rights and regulations. In addition, both VRD/CB and the County fully support the principles of Affirmative Action and non-discrimination.

3. VRD/CB and the County shall provide for the free exchange of information between the divisions and the County as it relates to the individual client and is necessary for sound case management decisions. Both divisions and the County will respect and comply with the confidentiality procedures of each division, to the extent permitted by Oregon law.

VI. Indemnification and Insurance

1. No party to this agreement shall be responsible for any legal liability, loss, damages, costs, and expenses arising in favor of any person, on account of personal injuries, death, or property loss or damage occurring, growing out of incident to, or resulting directly or indirectly from the acts or omissions of any

other party under this agreement. Both the County and VRD and CB shall obtain and at all times keep in effect comprehensive liability insurance and property damage insurance covering each respective party's own acts and omissions under this agreement or shall self insure for such risks. Such liability insurance, whatever the form, shall be in the amount not less than the limits of the public body tort liability specified in ORS 30.270. In the event of the unilateral cancellation or restriction by the insurance company of either parties insurance policy referred to in this paragraph, the parties shall immediately notify each other verbally and in writing.

2. The Vocational Rehabilitation Division and Commission for the Blind, their members, their employees, and their clients are not employees of the County and are not eligible for any benefits through the County, including without limitation, federal social security, health benefits, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, and retirement benefits. Pursuant to ORS 656.043, Vocational Rehabilitation Division and Commission for the Blind shall provide workers' compensation insurance for all subject employees.

VII. Access to Records

1. The County, the Secretary of State's Office of the State of Oregon, the Federal Government, and their duly authorized representatives shall have access to the books, documents, papers, and records of VRD and CB which are directly pertinent to the specific Agreement for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and transcripts.

VIII. Amendment to Agreement

1. This agreement represents the complete agreement of the parties. Any previous agreements are hereby revoked and void. Any modification of the provisions of this agreement shall not be effective unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties.

IX. Termination

1. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual consent of all parties, or by either party upon 30 day notice, in writing and delivered by certified mail or in person to all other parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the County, Vocational Rehabilitation Division, and Commission for the Blind have executed this Agreement as of the date first above written.

I. Recommendation/Action Requested:

Approval of Budget Modification and all accompanying intergovernmental agreements.

II. Background/Analysis:

Oregon's 1993 Legislature passed House Bill 5061 which established the Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention (CAMI) Account. The CAMI Account provides funds to counties for the development and on-going support of assessment and advocacy centers as well as for the development and maintenance of multidisciplinary investigative child abuse teams. The funds are provided through an increase in the unitary assessment fees assessed on persons convicted of a crime, violation or infraction (excluding parking violations) by justice, municipal, district, circuit and juvenile courts.

The attached budget modification and intergovernmental agreements are the implementation of Multnomah County's MDT plan using funding from the Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention Account.

The goals to be achieved by 1999 include

1. Streamline and centralize the child abuse reporting and intervention process.
2. Maintain a Tri-County Child Abuse Assessment Center
3. Expand the Law Enforcement Investigative Task Force to include all law enforcement agencies in Multnomah County.
4. Ensure the availability of temporary care for and assessment of all abused children needing the service during the course of the assessment investigation.

5. Integrate prosecution of child sex abuse cases between juvenile and adult court systems.

Multnomah County anticipates achieving the following by 1997:

1. Combine the three existing child abuse assessment programs into the Tri-County Child Abuse Assessment Center by March, 1995.
2. Improve direct victim intervention services for Children by completing a series of special projects designed to eliminate trouble spots in the current intervention and investigation process.
3. Provide timely and appropriate social services response to children referred for allegations of child abuse by locating a CSD Protective Services worker with the Portland School Police.
4. Provide additional law enforcement investigative services including after hours and on weekends.
5. Purchase equipment, training, resource materials and supplies to provide MDT members with specialized training and current technology for case management and to upgrade skills.
6. Assess Multnomah County shelter care needs for abused children and recommend options for improving shelter services.

III. Financial Impact:

This grant appropriates \$426,414 primarily within the pass through line item. The grant pays all indirect costs (4.14%). The budget modification appropriates slightly more than one half of the grant to account for start up costs.

IV. Legal Issues:

V. Controversial Issues:

None.

VI. Link to Current County Policies:

The activities funded by this grant will enable the county to move closer to meeting its urgent benchmark of reducing domestic abuse. Specifically the grant will aid efforts to reduce the number of children abused or neglected.

This grant was applied for by the Multnomah County Multidisciplinary Team which is made up of representatives from the following organizations: Multnomah County (MC) District Attorney's Office, Children's Services Division, MC Health Department, MC Juvenile Court, MC ESD, area law enforcement agencies (Portland, Multnomah County Sheriff, Troutdale, Gresham, Fairview, Portland Public School and Oregon State), CARES Emmanuel Hospital, Kaiser Permanente, and Oregon Health Sciences University.

for the 1995 CAMI Grant

Childrens Services Division (CSD) and the County of Multnomah by and through Multnomah County District Attorney's office (MCDA) agree as follows:

A. GENERAL SCOPE

The CAMI Grant provides funding from the Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention Account to Multnomah County District Attorney's office according to the grant application and award documents.

Chapter 190 of the Oregon Revised Statutes provides for intergovernmental agreements. Therefore, the MCDA and the CSD agree to the following:

1. CSD agrees to establish a pilot project aimed at improving assessment and intervention services for children who are referred to the Portland School Police by mandatory reporters in the schools.

2. The pilot program will refine current protocols so that children receive intervention services in a timely and appropriate manner consistent with the CAMI program goals.

3. The pilot project will be staffed by a full time protective services worker who will be located at the Portland School Police office and will work with the School Police in prioritizing and assessing child abuse referrals.

4. CSD shall bill the MCDA office \$16,329 per quarter for personnel costs on the dates outlined below. One time only costs of up to \$7,500 for necessary computer equipment and modem, and \$650 for a cellular phone are also reimbursable under the terms of this contract. Documentation of equipment purchase should be attached to the quarterly reimbursement report in which these charges are submitted.

5. CSD shall have administrative authority for the establishment of standards and performance of the protective services worker assigned to child abuse investigations.

6. In the event of a dispute between the parties as to the extent and the nature of the duties and function of the protective services worker assigned to child abuse investigations, the resolution shall be made by the Administrative Manager of CSD and the District Attorney or their delegated representatives.

7. Both parties are subject to the Oregon State Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.265, et. seq. The scope and limits of any and all liability for injury or damages to property or any third party shall be imposed in accordance with this law.

B. TERM

This agreement shall extend from January 1, 1995 through and including December 31, 1995.

C. TERMINATION

1. This agreement may be terminated upon 60 days mutual written consent of the parties or upon 90 days written notice by one of the parties.

2. Termination under any provision of this paragraph shall not affect any rights, obligations, or liability of CSD or MCDA which accrues prior to such termination.

E. MODIFICATION

This agreement may be modified by mutual consent of the parties. Any modification to provisions of this agreement shall be reduced to writing and signed by the parties.

F. INTEGRATION

This agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements.

Intergovernmental Agreement
for the 1995 CAMI Grant

December 14, 1994

The City of Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and the County of Multnomah by and through Multnomah County District Attorney's office (MCDA) agree as follows:

A. GENERAL SCOPE

The CAMI Grant provides funding from the Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention Account to Multnomah County District Attorney's office in accordance with the grant application and award documents.

Chapter 190 of the Oregon Revised Statutes provides for intergovernmental agreements. Therefore, the MCDA and the PPB agree to the following:

1. PPB agrees to provide detectives specially trained in conducting child abuse investigations during evening hours and on weekends to respond to child abuse referrals.

2. PPB shall submit invoices up to a maximum of \$20,000 for evening and weekend overtime worked by detectives conducting child abuse investigations on a quarterly basis as follows:

January 1, 1995 - March 31, 1995	By 4/20/95
April 1, 1995 - June 30, 1995	Estimate by 6/30/95

July 1, 1995 - September 30, 1995	By 10/20/95

3. The City shall have administrative authority for the establishment of standards and performance of the detectives assigned to child abuse investigations.

4. In the event of a dispute between the parties as to the extent and the nature of the duties and function of the PPB detectives assigned to child abuse investigations, the resolution shall be made by the Chief of Police and the District Attorney or their delegated representatives.

5. Both parties are subject to the Oregon State Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.265, et. seq. The scope and limits of any and all liability for injury or damages property to any third person shall be imposed in accordance with this law.

B. TERM

This agreement shall extend from January 1, 1995 through and including December 31, 1995.

C. TERMINATION

1. This agreement may be terminated upon 60 days mutual written consent of the parties or upon 90 days written notice by one of the parties.

2. Termination under any provision of this paragraph shall not affect any rights, obligations, or liability of PPB or MCDA which accrues prior to such termination.

The goals to be achieved by 1999 include

1. Streamline and centralize the child abuse reporting and intervention process.
2. Maintain a Tri-County Child Abuse Assessment Center
3. Expand the Law Enforcement Investigative Task Force to include all law enforcement agencies in Multnomah County.
4. Ensure the availability of temporary care for and assessment of all abused children needing the service during the course of the assessment investigation.

5. Integrate prosecution of child sex abuse cases between juvenile and adult court systems.

Multnomah County anticipates achieving the following by 1997:

1. Combine the three existing child abuse assessment programs into the Tri-County Child Abuse Assessment Center by March, 1995.
2. Improve direct victim intervention services for Children by completing a series of special projects designed to eliminate trouble spots in the current intervention and investigation process.
3. Provide timely and appropriate social services response to children referred for allegations of child abuse by locating a CSD Protective Services worker with the Portland School Police.
4. Provide additional law enforcement investigative services including after hours and on weekends.
5. Purchase equipment, training, resource materials and supplies to provide MDT members with specialized training and current technology for case management and to upgrade skills.
6. Assess Multnomah County shelter care needs for abused children and recommend options for improving shelter services.

III. Financial Impact:

This grant appropriates \$426,414 primarily within the pass through line item. The grant pays all indirect costs (4.14%). The budget modification appropriates slightly more than one half of the grant to account for start up costs.

VI. Link to Current County Policies:

The activities funded by this grant will enable the county to move closer to meeting its urgent benchmark of reducing domestic abuse. Specifically the grant will aid efforts to reduce the number of children abused or neglected.

VIII. Other Government Participation:

This grant was applied for by the Multnomah County Multidisciplinary Team which is made up of representatives from the following organizations: Multnomah County (MC) District Attorney's Office, Children's Services Division, MC Health Department, MC Juvenile Court, MC ESD, area law enforcement agencies (Portland, Multnomah County Sheriff, Troutdale, Gresham, Fairview, Portland Public School and Oregon State), CARES Emmanuel Hospital, Kaiser Permanente, and Oregon Health Sciences University.
