- The policy is not an unmitigated “NO” to other agencies concerned with public safety.
- Our compromise acknowledges that enforcement of federal civil immigration law is the responsibility of the federal government and not of State, County and/or City governments

- And yet our compromise acknowledges that we as County government have a responsibility to balance our community's need for public safety
- And the health and integrity of all families.
