


Black History Month Special Celebration Event





He has served on several civic commissions and boards, and as president of the Portland Chapter of the NAACP. In the past, he held leadership positions in professional organizations, taught community college courses, served as Training Officer of a federal government agency, hosted Albina Mosaic, the first weekly television program in Portland dealing with issues of concern to African Americans, performed two seasons with the Portland American Repertory Theater company, participated in several theatre productions of other groups, and appeared in a locally produced, independent, feature film.
