

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR
MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON

ORDINANCE NO. 35

An Ordinance prohibiting the use of official police markings and insignia to identify private security personnel.

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

Section 1. No person shall wear a badge or clothing marked or identified by the word "Police" or by any other marking or insignia customarily used to identify a police officer in any area of Multnomah County outside of incorporated cities, unless such person is authorized by law to do so.

Section 2. No person shall own or operate a private motor vehicle in Multnomah County outside of incorporated cities marked or identified by the word "Police" or any other marking or insignia identifying the vehicle as a police vehicle.

Section 3. No person shall, in Multnomah County outside of incorporated cities, assume to be, hold himself out to be or represent himself to be a police officer, either by words, actions or appearance, unless such person is authorized by law to do so.

Section 4. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the County jail for not to exceed six (6) months, or both.
