Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Updates	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Situation Reports will be released daily around 6:00 pm. ● > The Multnomah County Emergency Operations Center will be open over the weekend at normal hours - 8am-5pm. ● Regional health press conferences are now scheduled every Monday and Thursday at 2pm to provide COVID-19 updates. ● > Guidance for business is now posted on the county COVID-19 website. There is also business guidance posted at Business Oregon. New guidance is also available for travelers and restaurants and food service. ● > Pages are now available on the website for ten languages other than English. The pages offer COVID-19 prevention information in Spanish, Russian, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Somali, Vietnamese, Korean, Arabic, French, Japanese, Nepali and Swahili. ● > Guidance is being finalized for individuals experiencing homelessness outside of shelters. The guidance will also support those performing outreach to the unsheltered community. ● > Guidance is also being finalized for caring for a sick person at home. ● > The Continuity of Operations Planning (COOP) supervisor is working to apply the county's equity lens to ongoing COOP planning. ● > The curriculum from county COVID-101 outreach workshops is now available here. The curriculum is designed to be used by those who do culturally or population-specific work in the community (community health workers, home visitors, patient navigators, peer support specialists, etc.). ● > Signage from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has been received by County Facilities and is being posted in employee areas of county-occupied buildings. 	

- COVID-19 informational videos began filming today (Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, and Somali, with other languages being planned). The videos should be completed and available on the County website next week.
- Liaisons with subject-matter expertise have been identified to provide support to community organizations, businesses, and agencies. The identified liaisons will meet on Monday to coordinate situational information and begin plans to conduct train the trainer outreach. The liaisons are now available to provide information to agencies and community organizations that perform work across various sectors. The list of liaisons is below, and they can be contacted by members of their respective sectors. Sectors where a liaison is not shown are not yet filled. If you are interested in serving as a liaison, please contact the Liaison Unit Leader. Please note that the cost for non-county staff interested and able to fill vacant roles will be the responsibility of their organization.

Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical
