OPEN LETTER TO THE JUDICIARY

Dear Judge Nan G. Waller,

I was in courtroom 602 today on 2/11/2014 and saw something that I have never witnessed before in the dozens of courtrooms I have been in. Judge Randy Weisberg's court was being run by a group of transit cops who came in and sat down in the jury box and proceeded to call out names of people who were scheduled to appear. I thought this to be unusual and wanted to know what the transit cops had to do with the defendants after the tickets were written and why they were allowed to talk to the defendants at all without the judge being present. There seems to be a strong possibility that the transit cops were intimidating the defendants into a plea to pay \$80.00 and not go before Judge Weisberg. When I mentioned to one of the transit cops that I thought this action by them was way over the line and they should cease at once, she threatened me with expulsion from the courtroom. How is it possible that transit cops have that much power in your courtrooms? Their jurisdiction only covers Metro property and does not give them any authority to hold plea bargains before the judge comes into the court. A call to your clerk was even more frustrating because he seemed to think this was business as usual. I demand an internal investigation of what is happening in court 602 and any other court where transit cops are running the show. If what I have reported is true, all plea bargains should be thrown out and tickets rescinded.

PS. When a transit police person does not show up for court you should hold them in contempt and charge them the full amount of the ticket they submitted.
