**ORDER NO. 00-176**

Approving the Exemption to Extend the Contract with Burns International Security Services for Multnomah Building Until April 30, 2001 and to Use an Alternative Procurement Method to Contract for Security Guard Response Services

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:**

- a. The Board, acting in its capacity as the Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board to review, pursuant to PCRB Rules 10.140, a request from the Environmental Services Department, Facilities and Property Management Division, for an exemption to extend the contract with Burns International Security Services for security guard response services to the Multnomah Building until April 30, 2001 and to use an alternative procurement method to contract for security guard response services. The estimated cost of this contract is \$135,600 per year.
- b. As it appears in the memorandum from Mike Oswald, the request for exemption is based upon the fact that the County is currently utilizing the City of Portland's contract with Burns International Security Services for security guard response services to the Multnomah Building. This contract expires October 31, 2000. The Facilities and Property Management Division desires to use the formal Request for Proposal process to contract for security guard response services to the Multnomah Building. This alternative procurement method will best meet their needs because it allows them to evaluate contractor's qualifications and cost proposals which will include the requirements of the County's living wage policy.
- c. This exemption request is in accord with the requirements of Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board Administrative Rules 10.140.

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners, Acting as the Public Contract Review Board Orders:**

The contract with Burns International Security Services for security guard response services to the Multnomah Building may be extended until April 30, 2001, and the request for proposal process may be used to contract for security guard response services to the Multnomah Building.


