
Annual Museum Attendance

2017 saw our 2nd highest attendance ever!


Annual Museum Attendance

- GOAL: Create, collect, preserve, and provide access to digital materials from the OHS Research Library collections
- Over **15,000** manuscripts, photographs, films, and oral histories now available, with content added each week



Reuniting Finley and Bohlman was unanimously chosen by the State Library as the LSTA Project of the Year because it struck an exceptional balance between building a new digital collection and creating new programming and outreach efforts with partner agencies that helped engage new audiences.

- Schools can rent educational trunks containing hands-on objects, lesson plans, and primary source documents
- Topics include Oregon Trail, Chinese Traditions, Mexican American Arts & Culture, Oregon is Indian Country, Eastern Oregon
