Background

- Chair Kafoury asked for an evaluation and recommendations on moving MHASD to the Health Department
- Stakeholder feedback
- Review of technical, legal and budgetary changes



Goals

- The purpose of the reorganization is to improve integration of both policy and programmatic functions related to health system transformation
- There should be no disruption in service for the community, and
- Cost neutral to the general fund



Moving the Mental Health and Addiction Services Division into the Multnomah County Health Department.

- Prepares the county for the full implementation of the Affordable Care Act
- Creates the foundation for improved client outcomes
- Aligns our structures with our regional and state partners



Collaboration and Innovation

- School Based Health Centers and School Based Mental Health Services
 - Medical records pilot
- Early Childhood Integration
- Increased collaboration between the Local Public Health Authority and the Local Mental Health Authority
 - Suicide Prevention

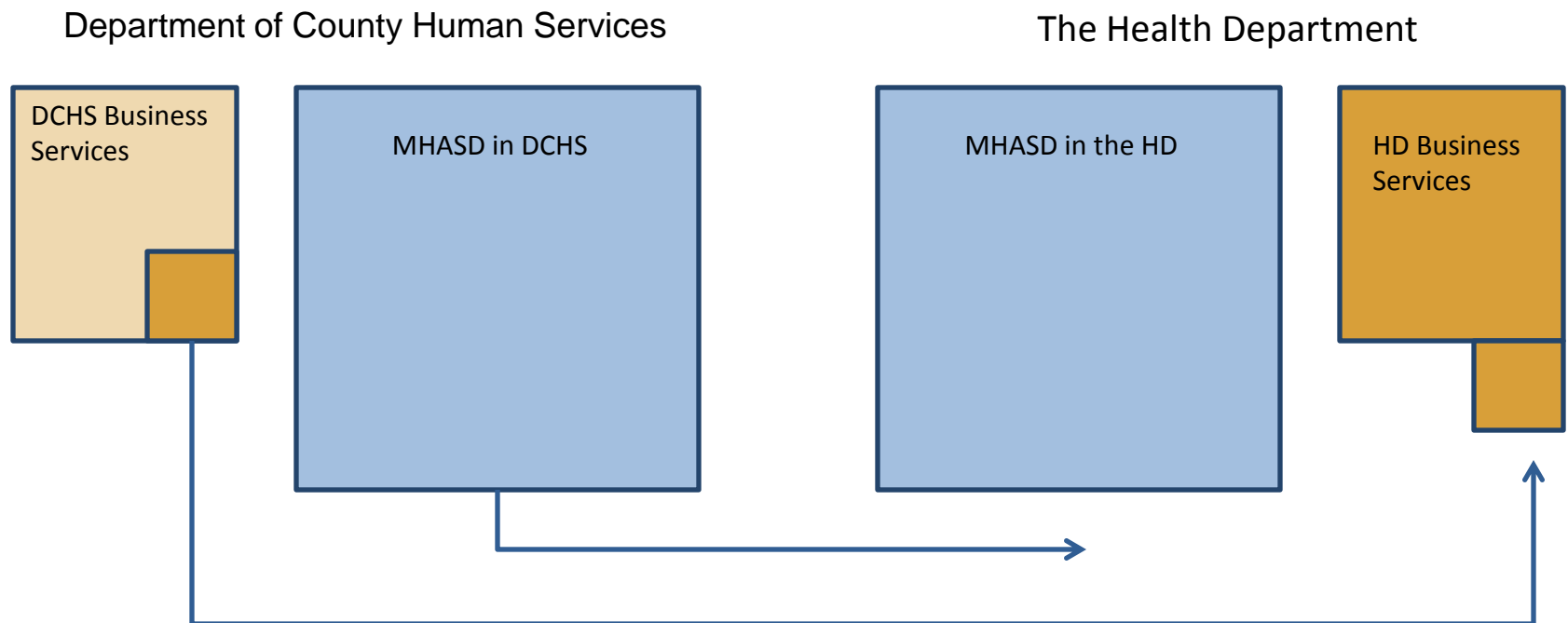


Process and Planning

- Working group formed to process map all functions for a seamless transition
- Input from internal and external partners
- Transition will take full effect on July 1, 2015



Structural Changes



- No Structural changes to the MHASD division services or staffing. MHASD Director will report to the Health Department Director rather than DCHS Director
- The Business Services' staff moving from DCHS will be incorporated into the existing Health Department's Business Services Unit.
