General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

None, this is an information briefing for the board on the East Metro Connections Plan.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue.

The East Metro Connections Plan (EMCP) is an 18-month project that seeks to allocate limited transportation dollars to ensure regional transportation investments between I-84 and US-26 and within 181st and 257th Avenue, in a manner that supports local land use, community and economic development, and the environment. The Board received a project briefing on November 8th, 2011, and this follow-up presentation will include priorities around transportation investments to advocate for in the near- and long-term.

The final product, expected this summer, will be a community investment strategy that identifies specific transportation, community, economic development projects and their phasing over the next 20 years.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

Multnomah County's portion of the local match for this study was \$14,212.
