Hazard Mitigation

- *Sustained* actions taken to reduce *long-term risk* to life and property
- Natural hazards cannot be prevented, but their impacts can be reduced through hazard mitigation

Multi-jurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan

Every \$1 in mitigation investment saves an average of \$4 in future disaster-related costs*



* *Natural Hazard Mitigation Saves: An Independent Study to Assess the Future Savings from Mitigation Activities*



Requirements

- Requirement to comply with the Disaster Mitigation Act (DMA) 2000 (Public Law 106-390)
- Makes jurisdictions and the County eligible to apply for FEMA mitigation project grants
- FEMA requires a plan update every five (5) years
- Plan must have projects being implemented on an ongoing basis

Requirements

- Defined by Federal regulations. Requirements and procedures for State, Tribal and Local mitigation plans contained in Code of Federal Regulations
- Title 44, Chapter 1, Part 201




