## General Information

### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Public Hearing and adopt resolution effective July 1, 2013, to increase plumbing permit fees in the planning area served by the City of Portland under intergovernmental agreement and repealing Resolution No. 2012-070,.

### 2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

The City of Portland provides plan review, permit issuance, and inspection services in certain areas of unincorporated Multnomah County under an IGA which stipulates that fees charged for those services must cover the full cost of their provision. The City of Portland is proposing an increase in some fees beginning July 1, 2013 in order to reach full cost recovery as required by the IGA and to have financially prudent reserves.

BDS recognizes the impact that fee increases have on its customers. However, not increasing fees would have significant impact on both the bureau and our customers and stakeholders:

- Service levels would remain at unacceptably low levels, hindering development at a time when it's desperately needed.
- Bureau reserves would remain at relatively low levels, leaving BDS vulnerable if another recession were to occur.

- Cost recovery efforts would slip.

BDS is continuing a comprehensive approach focused on addressing service levels, funding, and staffing issues. Key elements of this effort include:

- Seeking efficiencies in bureau programs and services.
- Closely monitoring finances.
- Pursuing cost recovery for services through moderate fee increases.

**3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).**

The fee changes cover actual costs of services as required by the IGA.

**4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.**

Complies with ORS 294.160 and MCC Chapter 29.

**5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.**

The City has held and the County will hold a public hearing as required under ORS 294.160.
