MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON

Ordinance No. 526

An Ordinance creating a Committee for Citizen Involvement in Land Use for the purposes of advising the Multnomah County Division of Planning on land use planning.

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Findings.

A. Goal 1 of Oregon's Statewide Planning Goals states in part:

"The citizen involvement program shall incorporate the following components.....as a component, the program for citizen involvement shall include an officially recognized citizen advisory committee or committees broadly representative of geographic areas and interests related to land use and land use decisions. Citizen advisory committee members shall be selected by an open, well-publicized public process.

The citizen advisory committee shall be responsible for: assisting the governing body with the development of a program that promotes and enhances citizen involvement in land use planning, assisting in the implementation of the citizen involvement program and evaluating the process being used for citizen involvement."

B. In 1975 the Board adopted an order appointing the Planning Commission as The Committee on Citizen Involvement (CCI). In 1976 however, the Division of Planning and Development, with Planning Commission concurrence, set up a citizen CCI separate from the Planning Commission. This group was made up of nine members, two from the Planning Commission, the others were citizens of a broadly geographic representation from the County. The County's overall citizen involvement program was approved by the LCDC in 1980.

C. Multnomah County's Comprehensive Framework Plan has a Citizen Involvement Policy (#3) which states in part, "The County's Policy is to maintain a Committee for Citizen Involvement and an ongoing citizen involvement program that is appropriate to the scale of the ongoing planning effort....". The County has not had an active CCI for over three years.

- D. The Multnomah County Citizen Involvement Committee has recommended that the County reactivate its Committee for Citizen Involvement for land use planning so that it is in compliance with State Goals and with its own Comprehensive Plan.

SECTION 2. Action.

- A. A Committee for Citizen Involvement in Land Use is hereby established which shall assist the Division of Planning and Development in implementing its Citizen Involvement Program and evaluating the process being used for Citizen Involvement.
- B. The Committee shall be made up of five members who shall be appointed by the County Executive and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.
- C. The Committee shall be made up of the following people:
- Position 1. One member of the Multnomah County Planning Commission
  - Position 2. One member of the County Citizen Involvement Committee.
  - Position 3. One resident of Multnomah County from the unincorporated rural area west of the Willamette River.
  - Position 4. One resident of Multnomah County from the unincorporated rural area east of the Willamette River.
  - Position 5. One at-large resident of the urban unincorporated area.
- D. The following terms shall apply for the initial appointments and shall be three years thereafter:
- Position 1. 2 Years
  - Position 2. 1 Years
  - Position 3. 3 Years
  - Position 4. 3 Years
  - Position 5. 2 Years
- E. The Committee shall meet at least twice a year and shall be staffed by the Planning staff of the Division of Planning and Development
- F. Any recommendations of the Committee shall be made in writing to the Director of the Department of Environmental Services and to the Chairperson of the County Citizen Involvement Committee and the Planning Commission.


