## General Information

### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Adoption of Resolution Establishing Fees and Charges for Chapter 13 of the Multnomah County Code Relating to Animal Control and Repealing Resolution No. 2010-098.

### 2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer(s) this action affects and how it impacts the results.

The current fee structure was adopted by the Board in July 2010. Since that time, the Animal Service's business practices have evolved resulting in the need to adjust the fee structure. Such changes include the discontinuation of spay/neuter deposits, addition of Animal Rescue Entity fees per ORS, restructuring of service provided (i.e. veterinary service, owner surrenders, euthanasia & cremation), and increased number of animals and types of animals adopted. These changes dictate the need to re-organize the fee structure to meet business practices. Additionally, the fee structure reflects price changes that more closely reflect the current market value for such services.

### 3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

It is anticipated that the changes will result in an ongoing annual revenue increase of approximately \$350,000.

### 4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

The primary policy issue involved is the increase in daily service fees and the impact that such will have upon the community. However, it should be noted that almost all of the increases are fairly small in amount and should have a minimal impact on individual

clients.

**5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.**

The Animal Services' Community Advisory Committee reviewed the proposed fee resolution.
