The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners finds:

- a. Every year more than 10,000 American workers are killed on the job, tens of thousands are permanently disabled, and millions are injured

- b. Another 100,000 workers die from cancer, lung disease and other diseases related to toxic chemical exposure at work

- c. Concerned Americans are determined to prevent these tragedies by:
 - Organizing Workers Memorial Day on April 28, a day chosen by the unions of the AFL-CIO as a day to remember these victims of workplace injuries and disease
 - Renewing our efforts to seek stronger safety and health protections, better standards and enforcement, and fair and just compensation
 - Rededicating ourselves to improving safety and health in every American workplace


The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners proclaims:
