Proclaiming April 1999 Alcohol Awareness Month in Multnomah County, Oregon

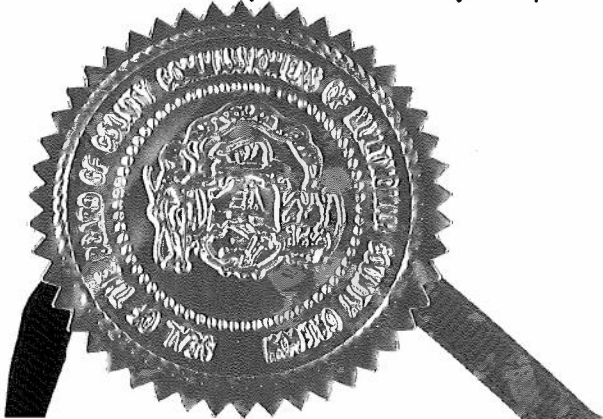
The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. Binge drinking is defined as consuming five or more drinks in a row at one sitting for boys and four or more in a row for girls.
- b. Binge drinking in high school is strongly predictive of binge drinking in college.
- c. Binge drinking among high school seniors has steadily increased over the past five years.
- d. Binge drinkers experience more alcohol-related problems affecting their health, safety and interpersonal relations, including driving after drinking, damaging property, getting injured, missing classes and getting behind in their school work.
- e. 43% of college students say they are binge drinkers and 21% say they binge frequently.
- f. Binge drinking, which can lead to fatal injury and alcohol poisoning, is widely recognized as the most serious problem facing college campuses today.


The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Proclaims:
