Exempting from the Formal Competitive Bid Process the Extension of Contracts with Eight Weatherization Services Providers until June 30, 2000

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. The Board, acting in its capacity as the Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board to review, pursuant to PCRB Rules 10.140, requests from the Department of Community and Family Services, for exemptions from the formal competitive bid process to extend the contracts with the following weatherization services providers until June 30, 2000:

Electrical Contractors and Design, Inc.
Rex Heating
Tri County Furnace
Richart Family
Mt Hood Weatherization
Alpha Energy Savers
All-Weather Home Remodeling
Advanced Weatherization & Construction

- b. As it appears in the memoranda from Lorenzo Poe, the requests for exemptions are based upon the fact that the Department of Community and Family Services is now in the process of a phased procurement of weatherization services. The major bid has been released and the two minor bids will be released later. A procurement plan has scheduled all bids in time to have new contractors in place before the end of the County fiscal year. Extension of the current contracts is necessary to cover the time until the new contracts are in place.
- c. These exemption requests are in accord with the requirements of Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board Administrative Rules 10.140.


The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners, acting as the Public Contract Review Board Orders:
