WHEREAS, Oregon's parks contribute directly to the quality of life of Oregon residents by providing a myriad of opportunities for active and passive recreation; and

WHEREAS, parks provide access to Oregon's lakes, mountains, rivers, forests and beaches; and

WHEREAS, access to Oregon's natural resources is a critical element in the State's multi-billion dollar tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, rehabilitation and expansion of Oregon's park systems has been deferred for nearly 20 years as a result of fiscal constraints at virtually all levels of government; and

WHEREAS, the demand for quality parks has continued to grow, despite fiscal constraints, due to an ever-increasing population throughout the State and expanding tourism industry; and


WHEREAS, population and tourism growth is expected to continue at an accelerated rate for at least 20 years; and

WHEREAS, continued growth underscores the necessity to restore and expand parks at all levels of government to meet the needs of Oregon citizens as well as our visitors; now therefore

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners supports Ballot Measure 1, which proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the State Legislature to sell up to \$250 million in general obligation bonds for the purpose of restoring and expanding Oregon's park systems.


