### General

- **Regional health press conferences** are now scheduled every Monday and Thursday at 2pm to provide COVID-19 updates.
- **Liaisons** hold weekly check-ins with stakeholders to address questions and concerns, as well as share guidance as it is released.
  - Dr. Present and Dr. Vines are hosting **weekly webinars** for outpatient clinical providers to review new guidance from OHA and answer questions.
- The EOC is guided by the equity considerations created by the Multnomah County Office of Diversity and Equity.
- The City of Portland and Multnomah County worked collaboratively to extend winter shelter locations for the foreseeable future to assist in maintaining homeless shelter capacity. Regular meetings are held to assist providers in implementing guidance to prevent transmission. A key goal is to separate the sick and the well in shared living environments.

### Updates

- >Today, the State of Oregon announced 8 new presumptive cases of COVID-19, including one in Multnomah County.
- >Chair Kafoury announced only essential staff are to report to work beginning tomorrow March 17th.
- >[PPS](#) has posted a list of sites where they are distributing meals from 11am to 1pm beginning Tuesday, March 17 through Friday, March 20.
- >Multiple counties have declared states of emergency or will at council meetings this week.
- >The City of Portland mandated that employees who can work from home can do so through March 26 with extension possible

- ➤ The Governor directed that no gatherings of larger than 25 people may occur and recommends none over 10, restaurants and bars are now restricted to carry-out only. If other businesses cannot meet the social distancing standards then they should close.
- ➤ The County will open an additional 400 shelter beds planned by 3/18/20. Additionally, a 100 beds each for those with acute respiratory symptoms and those with a positive COVID-19 diagnosis.
- ➤ The [City of Gresham](#) is closing for walk-in customers while continuing to provide services.
- ➤ [Kaiser](#) began issuing the first COVID-19 trial vaccine.
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- The CDC updated its guidance Sunday, March 15th on mass gatherings to recommend events of 50 or more scheduled in the next 8 weeks be canceled or postponed.
- Multnomah County and the newly established Joint Information Center at the City of Portland will hold weekday calls beginning on Monday, March 16th, 2020 to ensure efficient and consistent health and safety messaging.
- Updated guidance is being drafted for the website to help people know what to do when they are sick and when to seek medical help.

**Social Media Analytics (Updated on Tuesdays)**

- 14 COVID-19 Facebook posts between March 2 and March 7, reached 16,618 people.
- 13 COVID-19 Tweets between March 2 and March 8, with 47,545 impressions, 1,096 engagements, 53 re-tweets, and 121 likes.

**Situational News Outside Oregon**

- ➤Regal cinemas will be closing theaters beginning Tuesday, March 17, 2020.
- ➤Worldwide confirmed deaths are now over 6600
- ➤Seattle announces that \$5 Million in grocery vouchers will be provided to families impacted by COVID-19.

**Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical**

- This is a dynamic situation. Information and case counts are changing rapidly and the incident is on-going.
- The Oregon Health Authority has changed the personal protective equipment recommendation for COVID-19 testing. Once testing is offered by commercial labs, standard outpatient and hospital facilities should be able to perform testing without specialized equipment.
- Communicable Disease Team continues to follow-up with cases and monitor their contacts.

Beginning March 15, 2020, the Oregon Health Authority is updating the way we report COVID-19 cases in Oregon. Results from the Oregon State Public Health Laboratory no longer require confirmation through CDC. Because testing has expanded to include commercial laboratories, we are receiving results from multiple sources throughout the day. Also, OHA no longer receives detailed information about specific symptoms and severity of all people being tested for COVID-19 infection.

In an effort to get the most accurate and most current information to Oregonians, we will update statewide cases once a day.

**Our updates on cases will include:**

- Cases from the Oregon State Public Health Laboratory.
- Cases from commercial and out-of-state labs.
- Because confirmation from CDC is no longer required, we will simply report total number of cases and will remove earlier information about CDC confirmatory testing.
- Because reporting about travel and nature of illness isn't available for cases reported from commercial labs, we are removing hospitalization status and information about travel to a country where COVID-19 is circulating.
- We will continue to track and report COVID-19 deaths.

\*A PUI is an individual with COVID-19 symptoms—but not necessarily the virus—who may have been exposed through close contact with a confirmed case or travel to an affected region, or who has pneumonia, thought by the clinician to be viral, requiring hospitalization with no more likely diagnosis and no source of exposure has been identified.

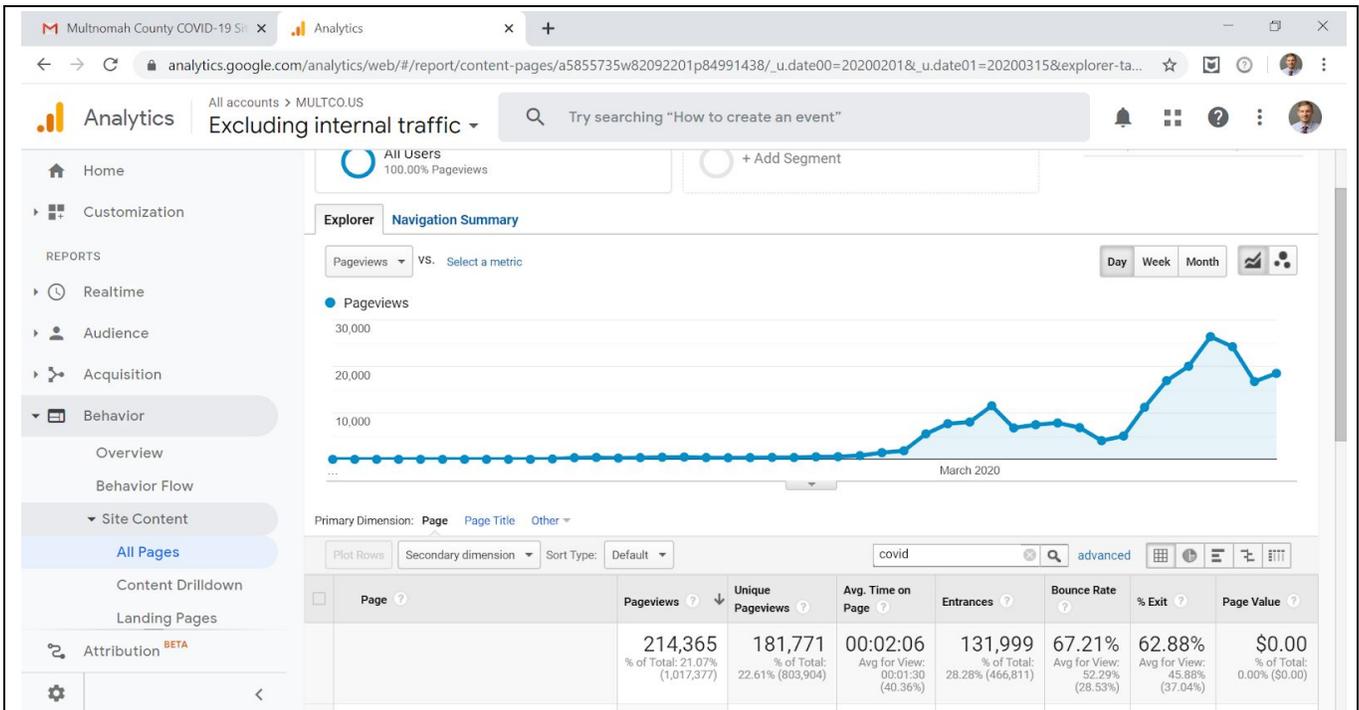
