General Information:

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

- The Multnomah County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) respectfully requests the Board of Commissioners adopt a Resolution and revised Jail Capacity Management Plan.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer(s) this action affects and how it impacts the results.

- The Multnomah County Sheriff's Office respectfully requests the Board of Commissioners adopt a Resolution and revised Jail Capacity Management Plan. The current Jail Capacity Management Plan was created by a committee of criminal justice system stakeholders and was last approved in July 2017. The Plan states that upon issuing a red alert/emergency population notice, MCSO develops a prioritized list of adults in custody based on criteria outlined within the Plan. A score is assigned to each criteria, which determines who will be forced released out of jail.

- The Sheriff's Office recently convened meetings with criminal justice system stakeholders to review existing standards for determining a population emergency and revise the Plan to resolve forced releases to the Board of Commissioners. The Sheriff's Office will brief the Board of Commissioners about stakeholder recommendations on November 13, 2018. Recommendations exclude Ballot Measure 11 crimes and Domestic Violence crimes from forced release and includes Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle (UUMV) convictions as a special consideration, before conforming the Plan and scoring criterion. As a result, MCSO requests Board adoption of the Resolution and revised Jail Capacity Management Plan at this Board Meeting accordingly.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

- The Jail Capacity Management Plan reflects existing budget allocations.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

- The Jail Capacity Management Plan is enacted in accordance with ORS § 169.042-046.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

- Revisions to the Jail Capacity Management Plan were raised in Local Public Safety Coordinating Council (LPSCC) Meetings, such as the Jail Workgroup.
