Proclaim July 26, 2013, as Americans with Disabilities
Act Awareness Day in Multnomah County, Oregon.

July 26th marks the 23rd anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), which was signed into law on July 26, 1990. The current text of the ADA includes changes made by the ADA Amendments Act of 2008, which became effective on January 1, 2009.

The ADA is one of America's most comprehensive pieces of civil rights legislation. It prohibits discrimination and guarantees that people with disabilities have the same opportunities as everyone else to participate in the mainstream of American life – to enjoy employment opportunities, to purchase goods and services, and to participate in State and local government programs and services.

Multnomah County's newest employee resource group is Abled and disAbled Advocates Partnering Together

(AdAPT), which focuses on the needs of employees who have disAbilities in addition to allies and advocates for people with disAbilities. AdAPT's mission is to enhance a culture of inclusion by leveraging each employee's unique abilities, raising awareness, valuing differences, removing barriers and encouraging a workplace built on dignity, trust, and respect.
