RE: COURTROOM SPACE BRIEFING

The primary element of this briefing will be your discussion with Courts personnel about their imminent needs to accommodate Judges. I cannot predict what agreements may be acceptable to both the County and the Courts in this matter, as positions on some elements of the accommodation have changed since our last briefing on this topic.

If the discussions arrive at the available space question, please consider the following:

1. Options for putting the BCC in the Portland Building, or Courts in the Justice Center, are currently not under discussion. Data on these options was provided to you as "Scrunch Plans" dated March 20 and March 29, 1991; and in the "Courtroom Space Plan" memo date April 19, 1991.
2. Leasing new space for any function is currently not under discussion. Myriad options exist.
3. The attached plans are schematic illustrations of the possibilities for moving all or part of the BCC to owned space at the Mead Building.
 - a. If all five Commissioners move to the Mead Building, potential locations are shown on sheets B, C, and D. A smaller Hearings Room would be created, using CIP contingency money, on the 1st floor of the Courthouse as shown on sheet E. The Courts would receive all of the 6th floor (except D.A. space) as shown at the top of Sheet A.

This provides space for three Courtrooms, as requested by the Courts, while retaining a Courthouse address for your Hearings; therefore it could function for several years.

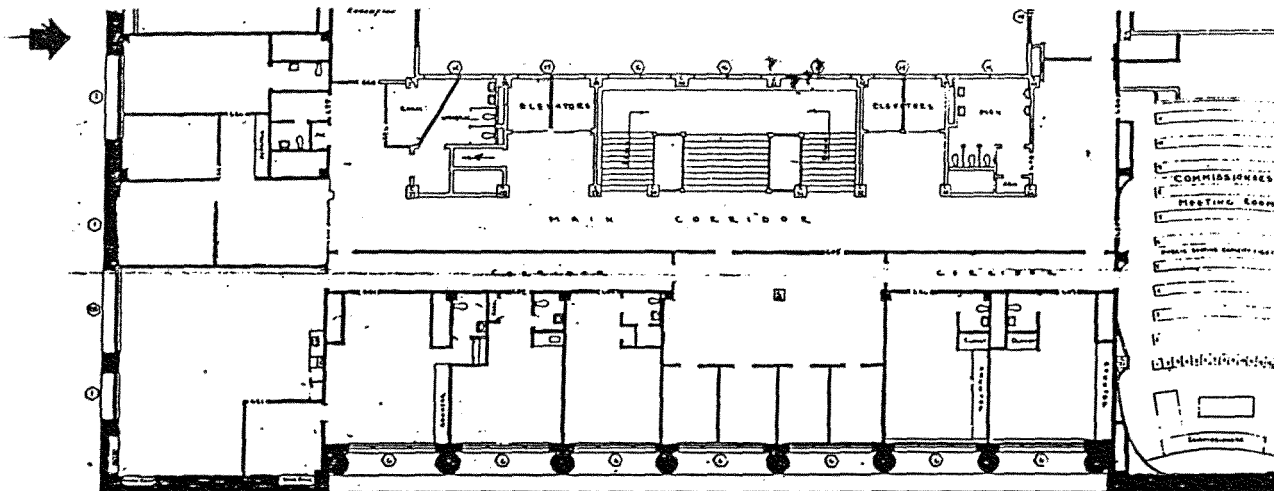

- b. If one Commissioner, plus the Chair, move to the Mead Building, the Hearings Room remains 602. The Courts receive space for one Courtroom, as shown at the bottom of Sheet A; plus they would backfill the Chair's space with administrative functions. A One-Courtroom solution may only buy the County a few months. Presumably, the other 3 Commissioners and the Hearings Room would have to move somewhere in the near future unless the Courts accept an alternative to the 6th floor for new Courtrooms.
- 4. I expect our search for a suitable long-term County Building to take several years, due primarily to funding constraints.

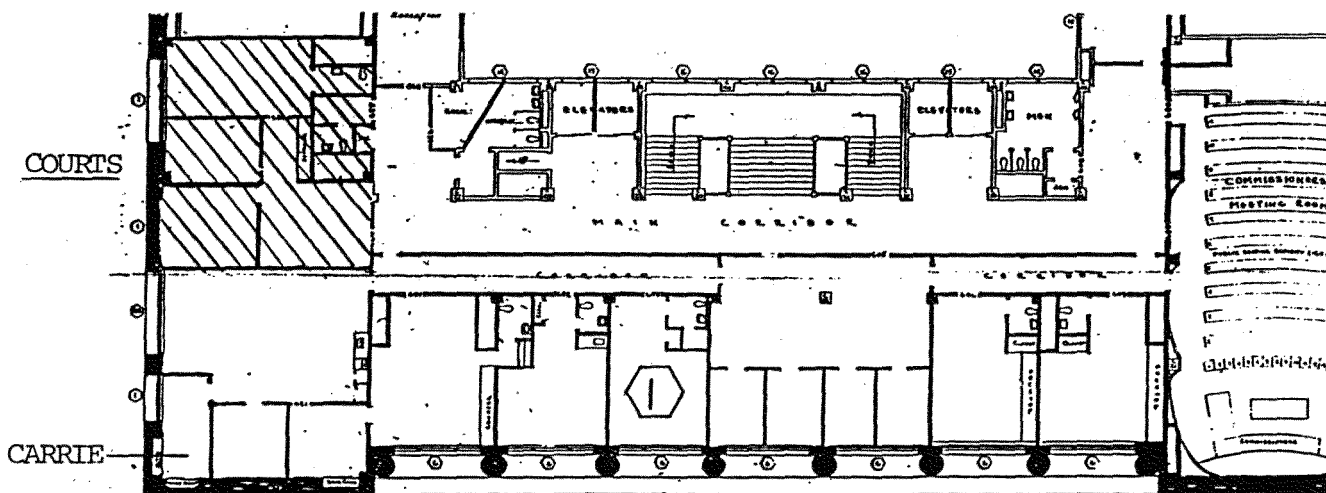

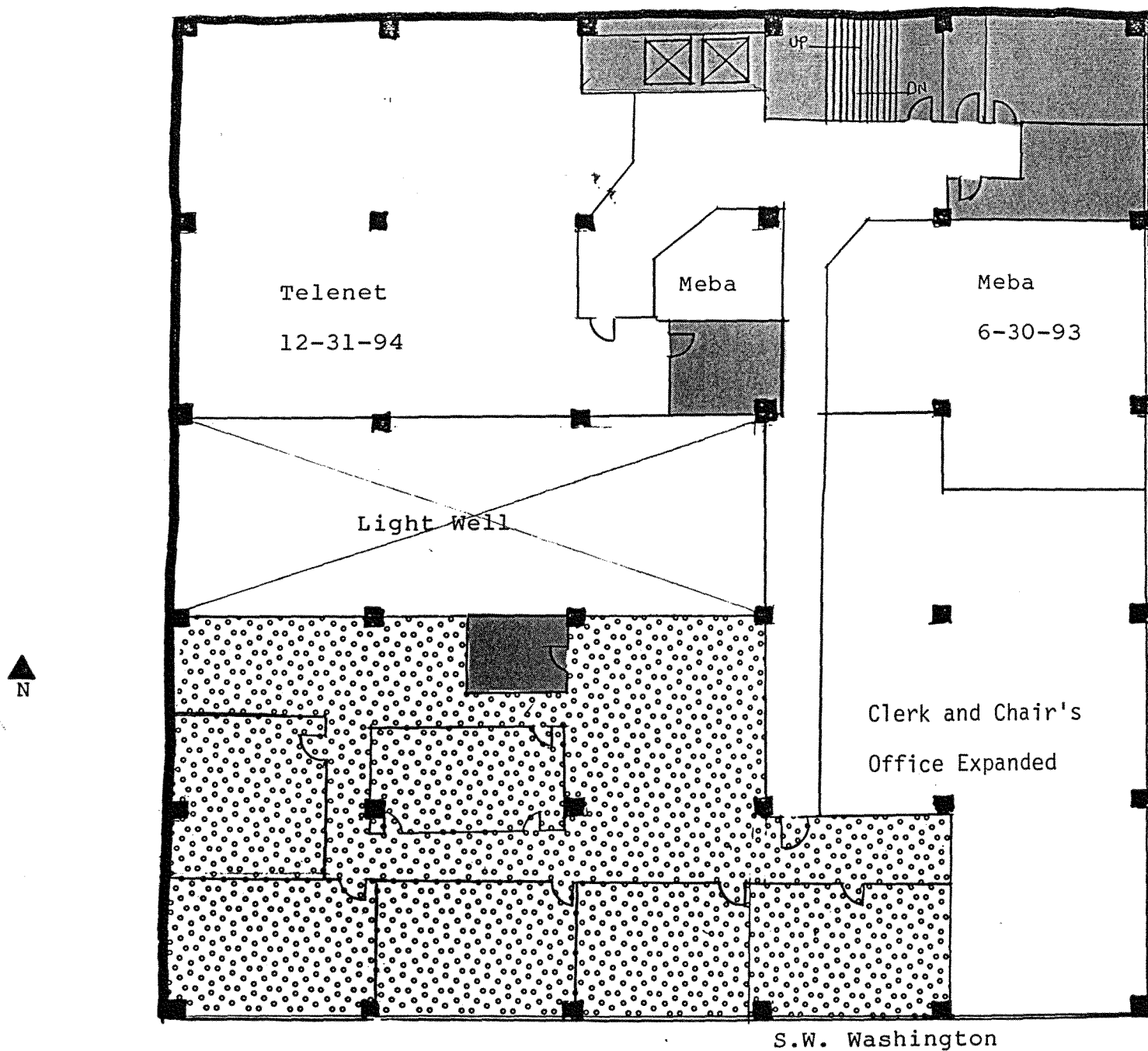



Fourth Floor Plan

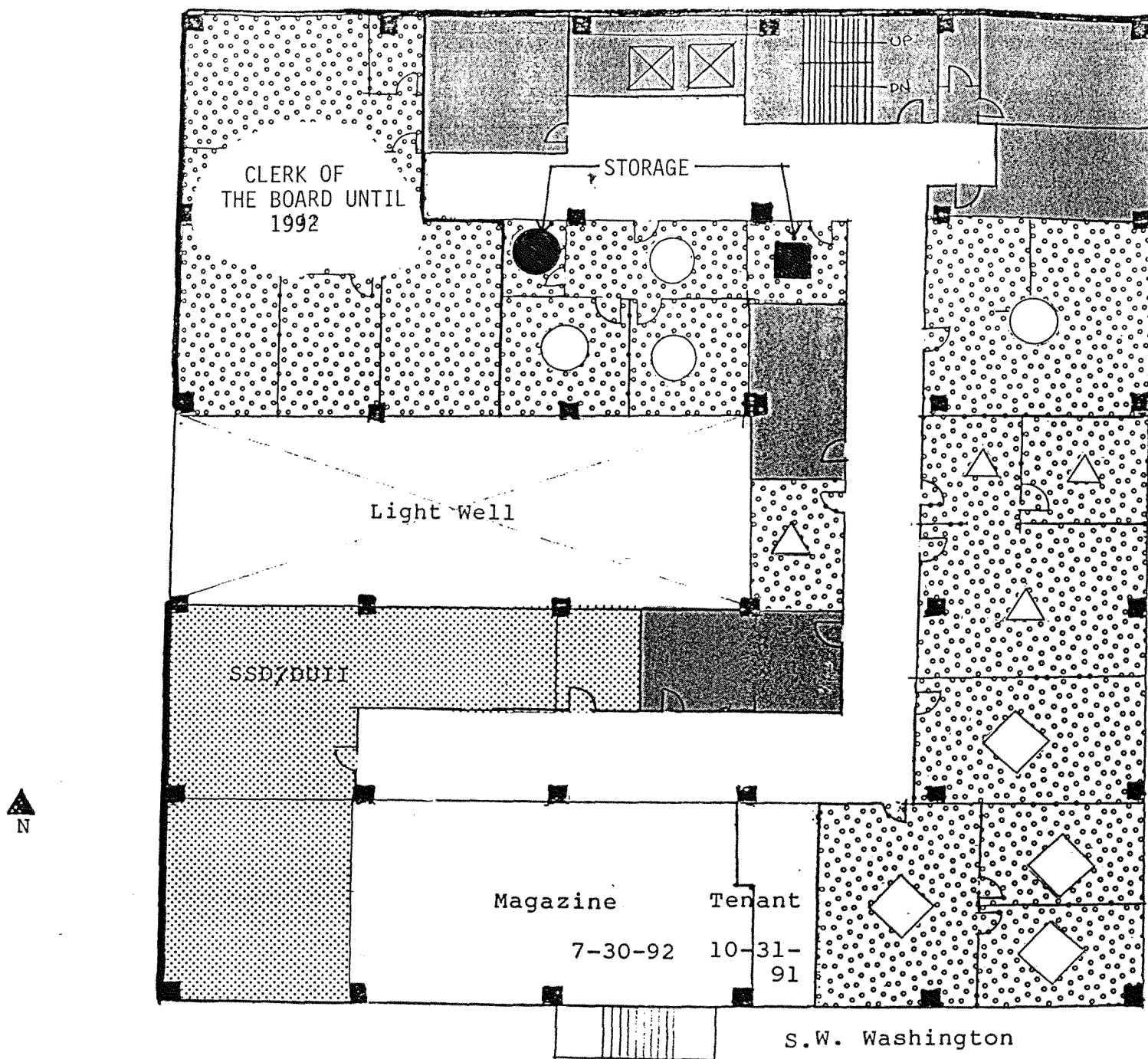

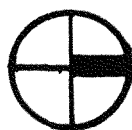
Partial 6th Floor Plan



Partial 2nd Floor Plan

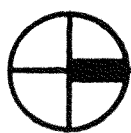
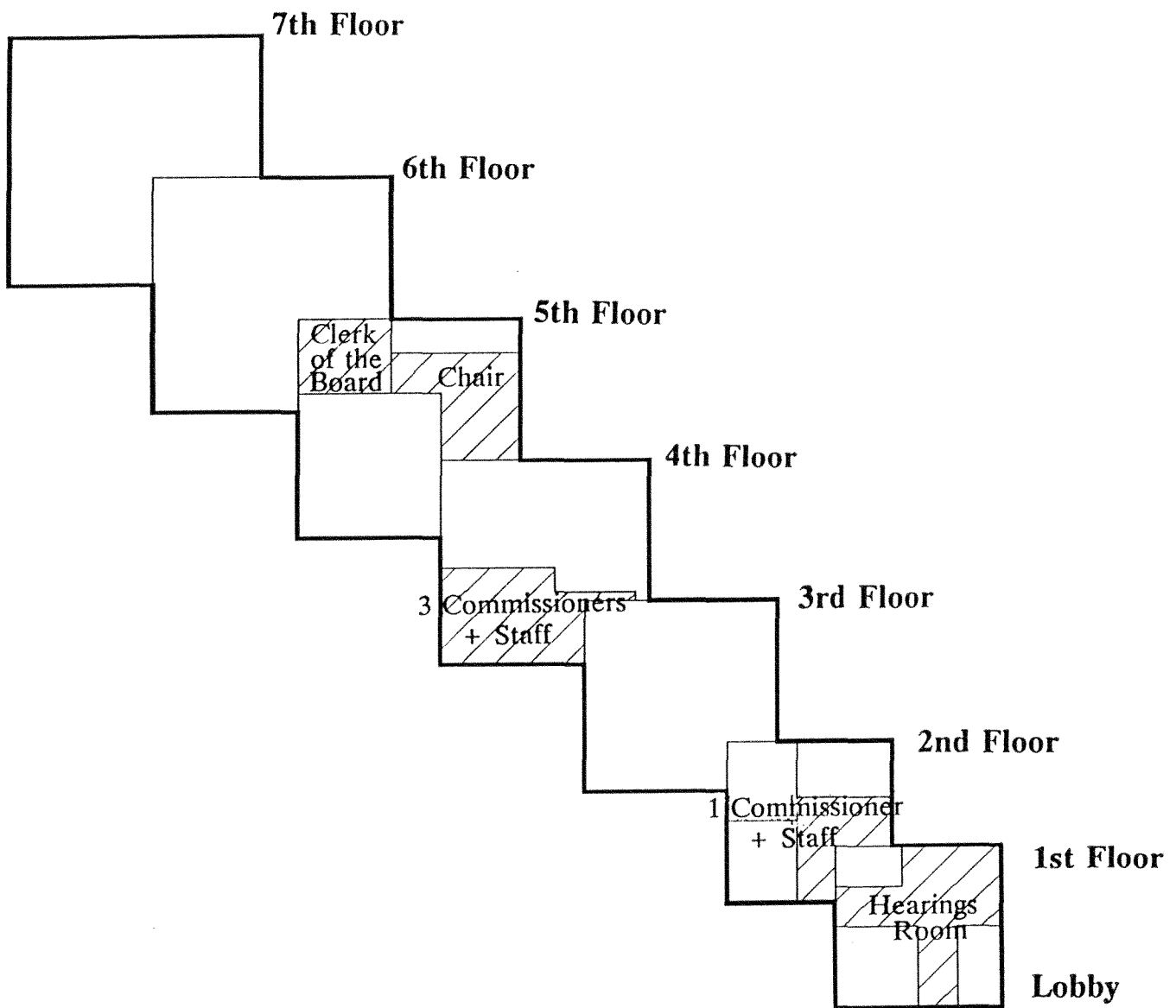


Partial 1st Floor Plan

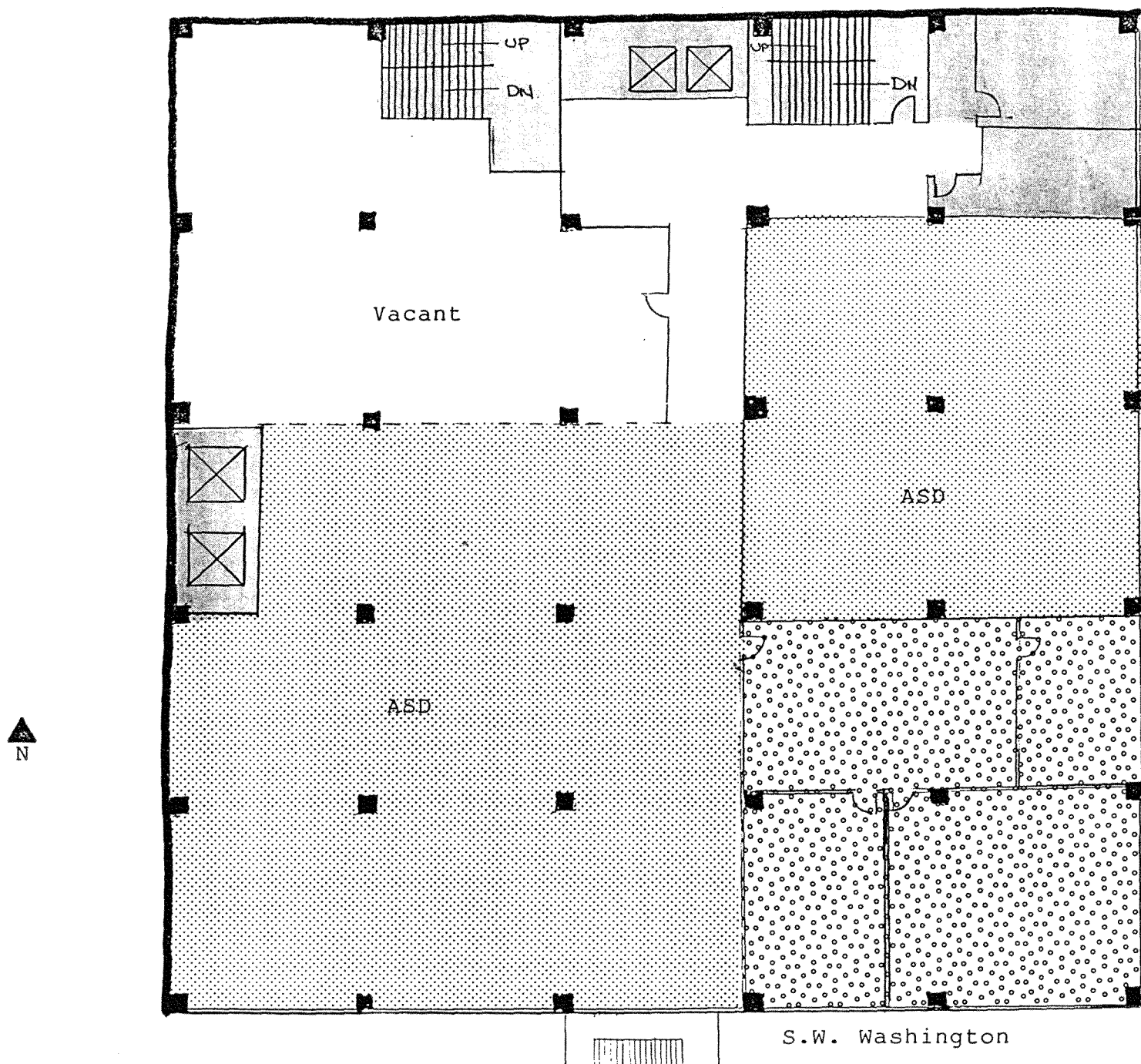
Mezzanine, First Floor

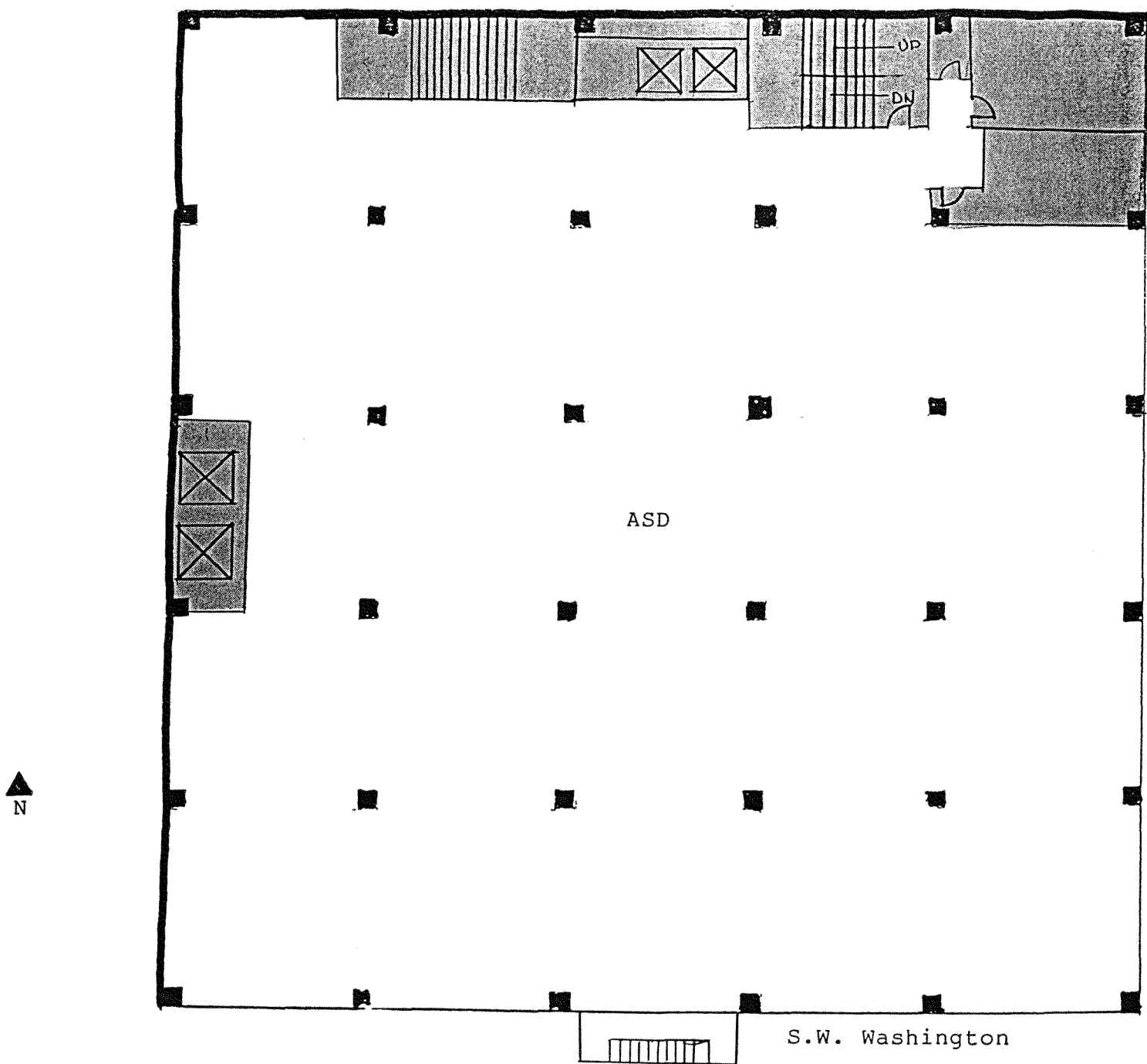


Second Floor Plan

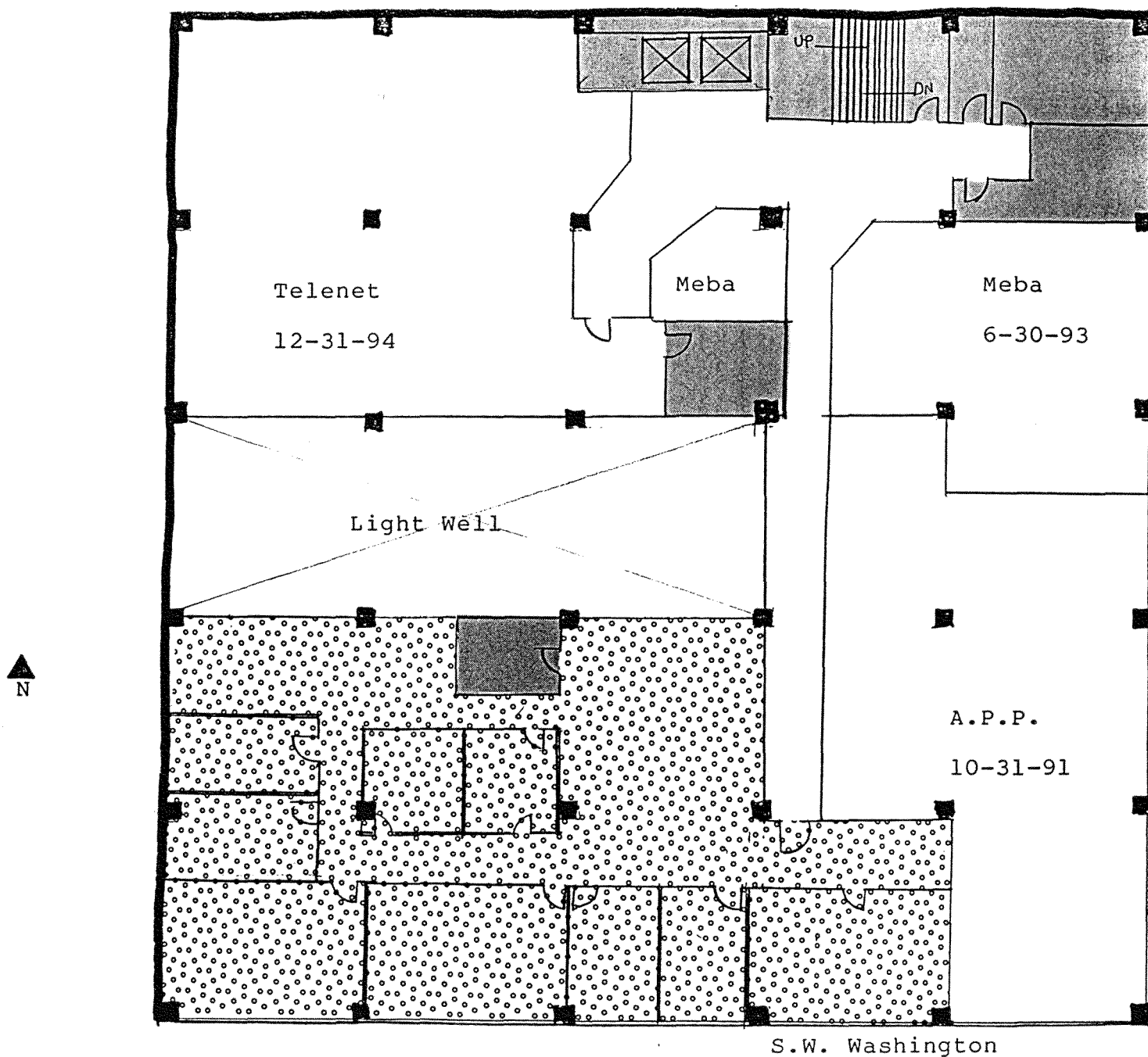

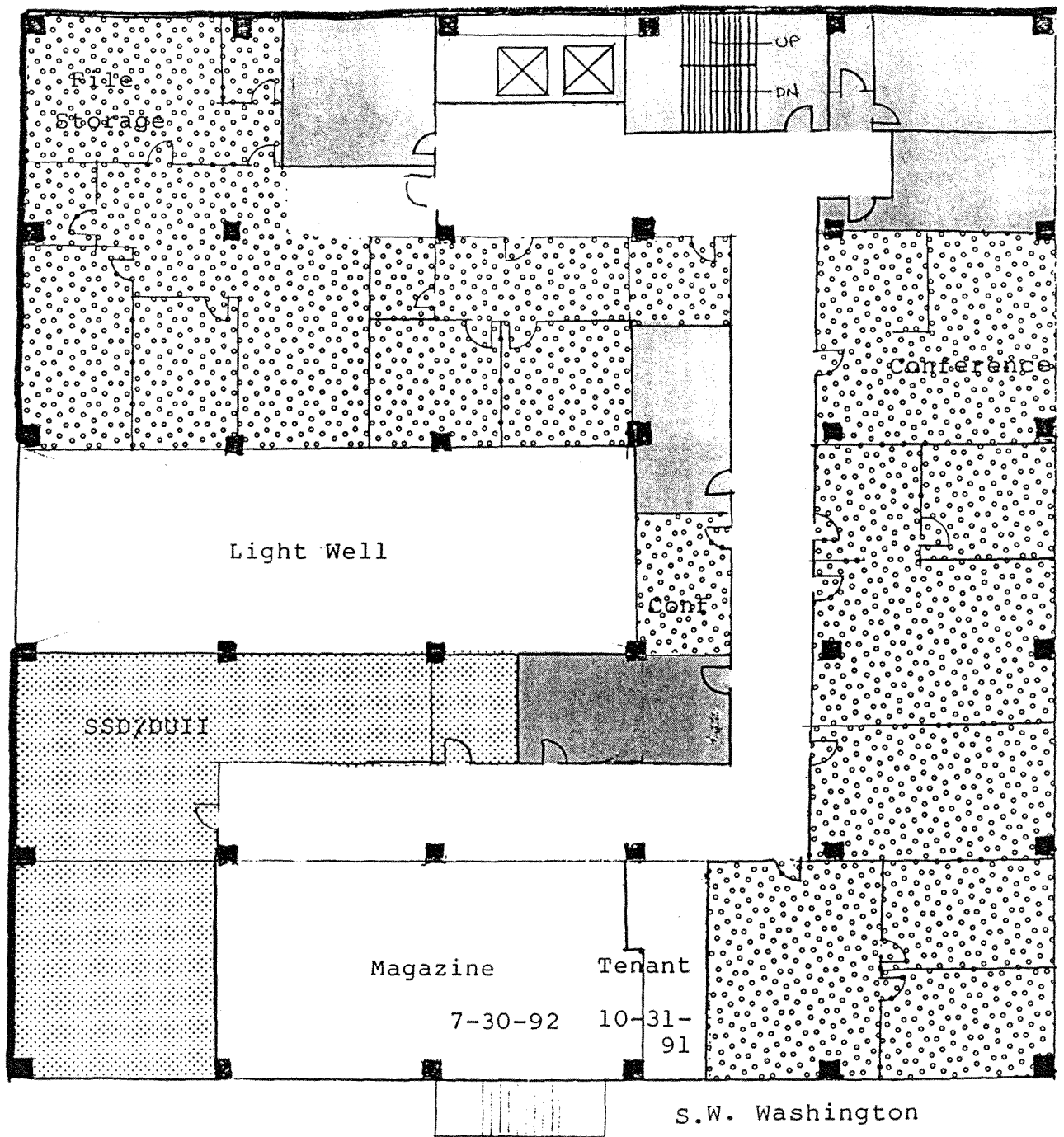

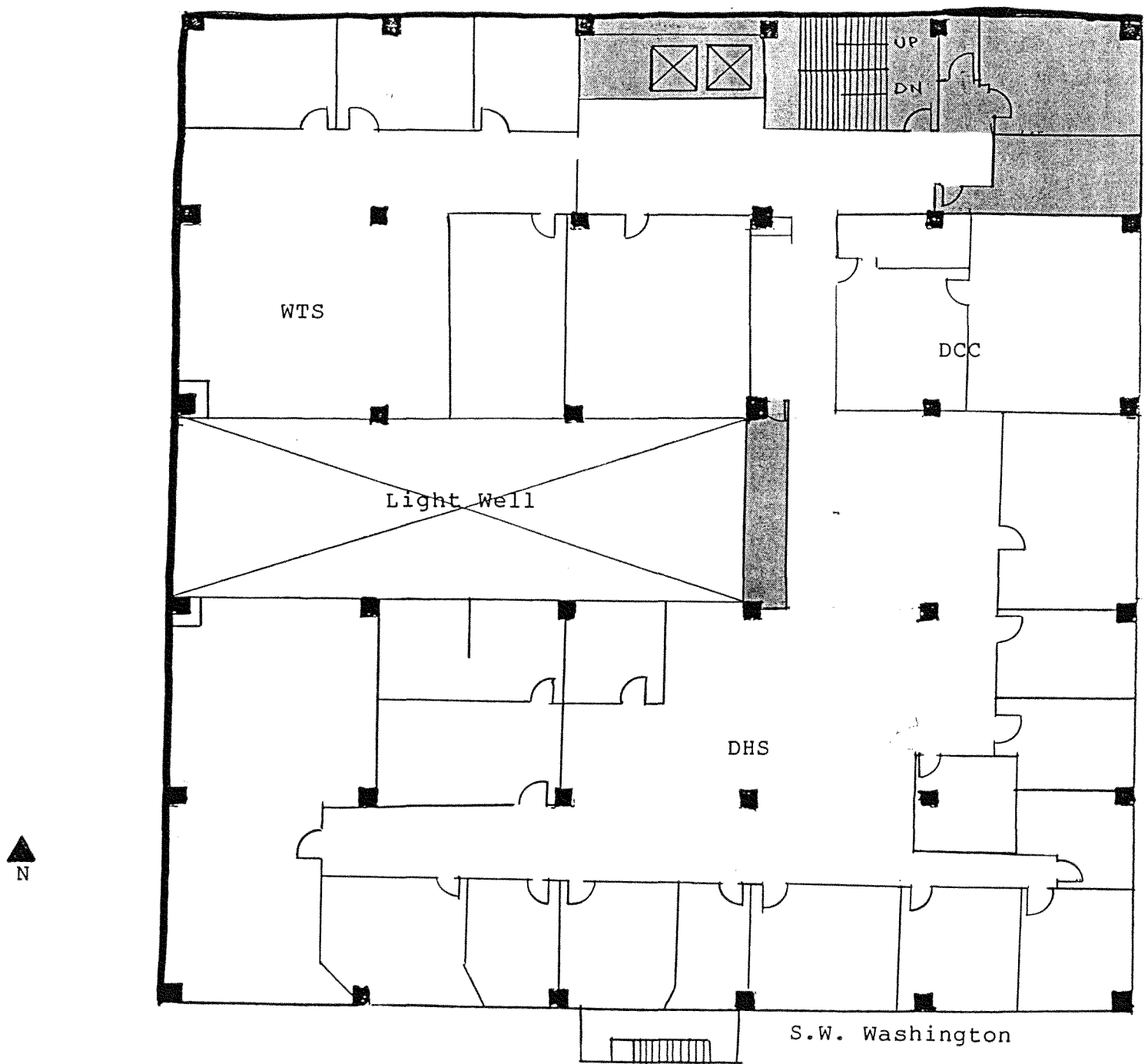


Fifth Floor Plan

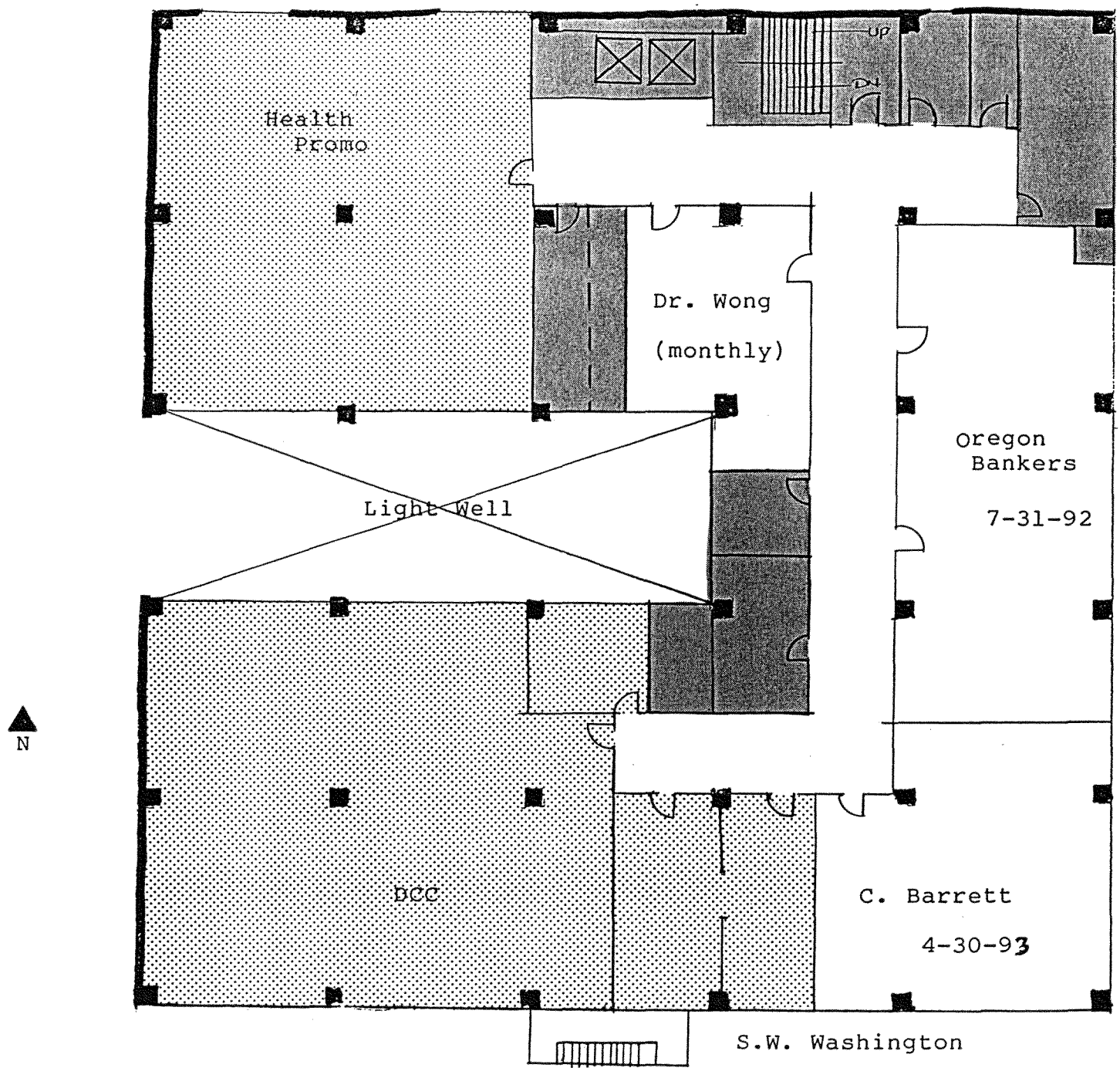


Sixth Floor Plan

SUBJECT: COURTROOM SPACE PLAN

We will be meeting with you on April 23, with the objective of receiving approval for implementation of the plan offered by the Courts at our April 9 meeting; that is, modifications to two Justice Center courtrooms for trial use and conversion of Commissioner Bauman's suite to a Judicial Mediation Center. The Courts have stipulated that the Justice Center solution be considered as an interim use, for no more than 12 months.

The attached material will be reviewed: cost estimates, a preliminary schedule, and schematic floor plans. Two options are shown for accommodating the 4 people displaced out of Room 606: the Mead Building and Courthouse 6th Floor. We hope to select one of these options at our meeting.

Facilities Management cannot represent that the attached scheme is fully descriptive of what the Courts will accept, but it is a scheme the County can perform. The Courts may elect to negotiate with you for a different outcome.

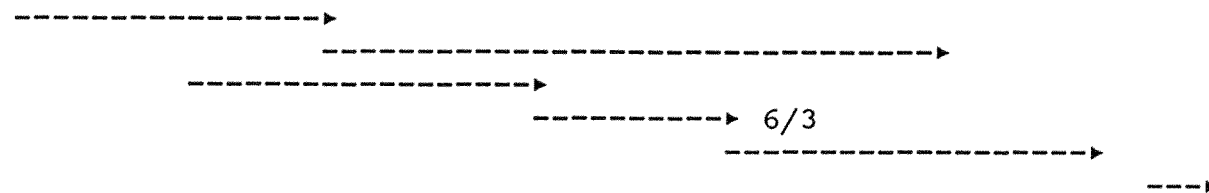

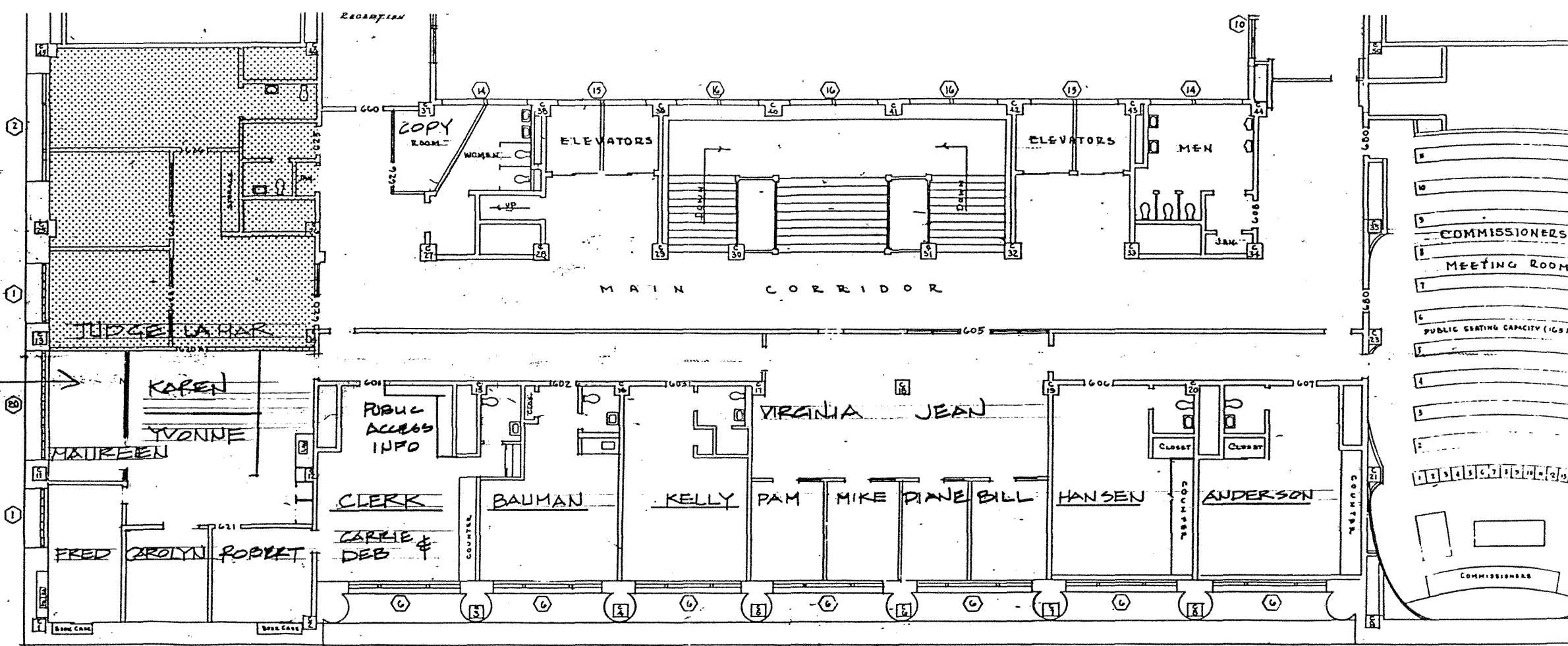

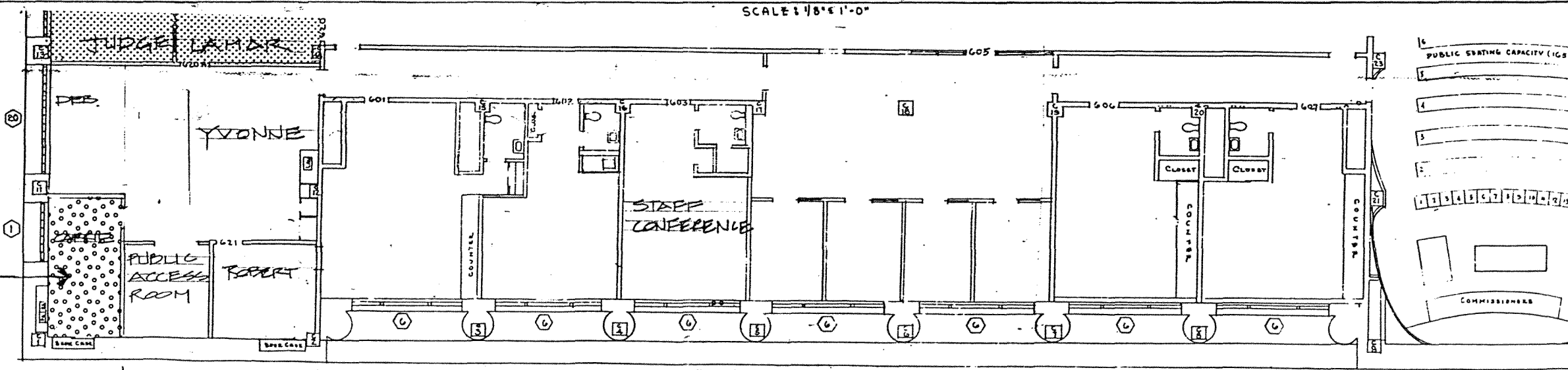
6TH FLOOR PLAN

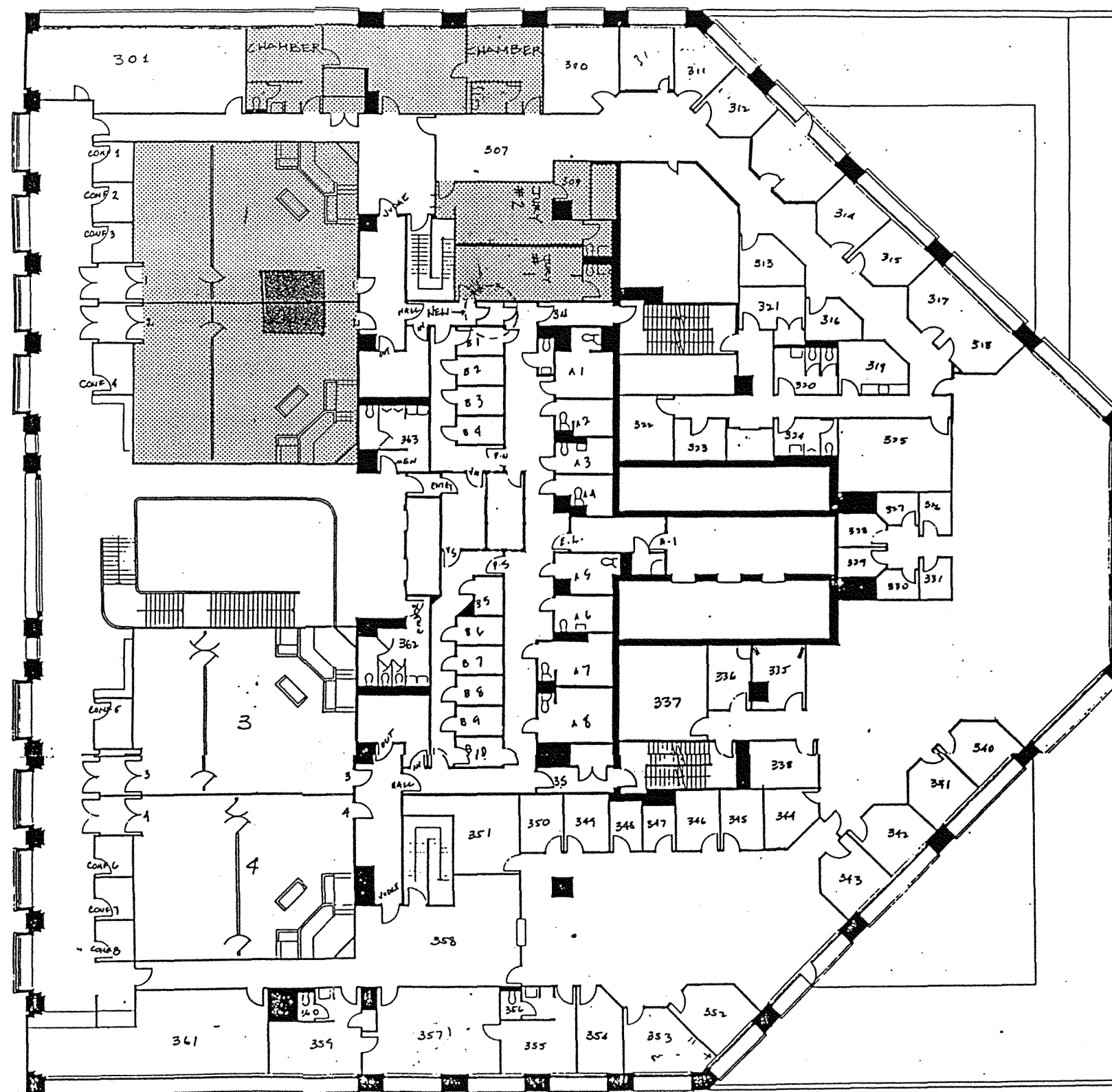


6TH FLOOR PLAN

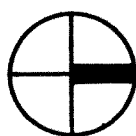
Partial 6th Floor Plan

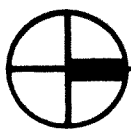
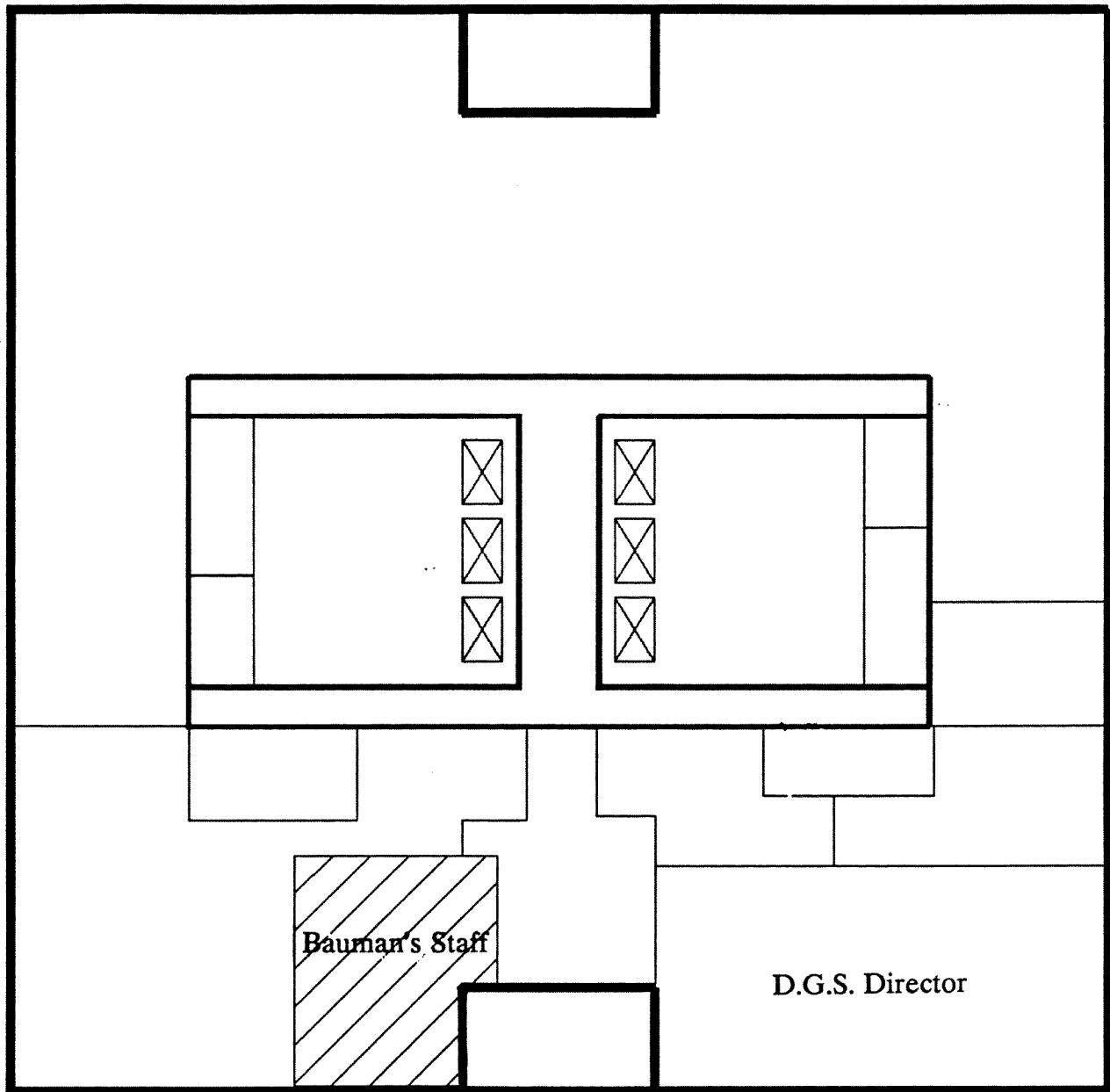


Partial 1st Floor Plan

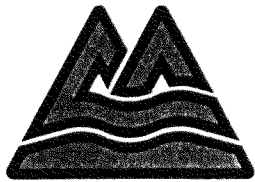
