General

Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Updates

- Situation Reports will be released daily around 6:00 pm.
- ➤ Today Oregon Gov. Kate Brown declared a state of emergency over the novel coronavirus. The state of emergency will remain in effect for 60 days, but could be extended if necessary.
- ➤ Oregon currently has 14 cases who tested positive for COVID-19.
- ➤ OHSU confirmed 1 patient tested positive for COVID-19. This patient is not believed to be a Multnomah County resident.
- Regional health press conferences are now scheduled every Monday and Thursday at 2pm to provide COVID-19 updates.
- ➤ A \$5 million funding request will be issued to the Oregon Legislature on Monday.
- Guidance is being finalized for individuals experiencing homelessness outside of shelters. It will also support those performing outreach to the unsheltered community.
- Homeless shelter capacity is being maintained while implementing guidance to prevent transmission. A key goal is to separate the sick and the well in shared living environments.
- A plan is being finalized to care for moderately-ill residents of homeless shelters and camps.
- Guidance is being finalized which will advise county residents when to seek healthcare and how to tell the difference between mild and serious illness.
- In response to national and state increases in COVID-19 cases, the Logistics Section has been working to fill new positions in the Emergency Operations Center for the upcoming week.
- New resource requests for personal protective equipment for healthcare workers and first responders were submitted to the State on Saturday 3/7/20.
- ➤ The Regional Public Health Multi-Agency Coordination Group (PH MACG) issued recommendations on 3/5/20. They suggested a system to help provide PPE for organizations that do not provide healthcare, but are "healthcare supporting settings." They also will work with OHA and equity planners to support self-isolating individuals.

- ➤ [Italy quarantined about a quarter of its population.](#)
- [Information is available on the county website in twelve languages other than English.](#) They provide COVID-19 prevention information in Spanish, Russian, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Somali, Vietnamese, Korean, Arabic, French, Japanese, Nepali and Swahili.
- The curriculum from county COVID-101 outreach workshops is available [here](#). The curriculum is designed to be used by those who do population or culturally-specific work in the community (community health workers, home visitors, patient navigators, peer support specialists, etc.).
- COVID-19 informational videos began filming on Friday, 3/6/20 (Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, and Somali, with plans for other non-English languages) and will resume production on Monday. The videos should be completed and available on the County website next week.
- Liaisons with subject-matter expertise have been identified to support community organizations, businesses, and agencies. The liaisons will meet on Monday to coordinate situational information and begin planning to conduct “train the trainer” outreach. The liaisons are available to provide information to agencies and community organizations. The list of liaisons is below. They are available to members of their respective sectors. Sectors with no liaison named are not yet filled. If you are interested in serving as a liaison, please contact the Liaison Unit Leader. Please note that the cost for non-county staff interested and able to fill vacant roles will be the responsibility of their organization.

Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical

- CDC testing criteria for COVID-19 has changed. The Oregon Health Authority is actively working on updating Oregon’s testing criteria and new guidance will be provided by the Tri-County Health Officer.

- ➤ 105,586 confirmed cases (3,656 new in the last 24 hours at time of report) and 3,584 confirmed deaths (98 new) worldwide.
 - There are confirmed cases in 102 Countries/territories/areas. Countries with their first reported case in the last 24 hours are Bulgaria, Costa Rica, Faroe Islands, French Guiana, Maldives, Malta, Martinique, and Republic of Moldova
