On November 2, 2010, Multnomah County voters approved a five-year levy of \$.05 per \$1,000 assessed valuation to keep the Oregon Historical Society (OHS) Library and Museum open to the public and to protect the collection of and access to Oregon historical documents and artifacts in the county. On April 28, 2011 The Board of County Commissioners approved Resolution 2011-048, which appointed the members of the OHS Levy Oversight Committee. A financial agreement between Multnomah County and OHS was executed on April 28, 2011. This financial agreement laid out requirements of the OHS Levy Oversight Committee – one of which is to provide an annual report to the Board of County Commissioners on OHS compliance with promises made in the ballot

language. This briefing and the attached report will satisfy this requirement.
