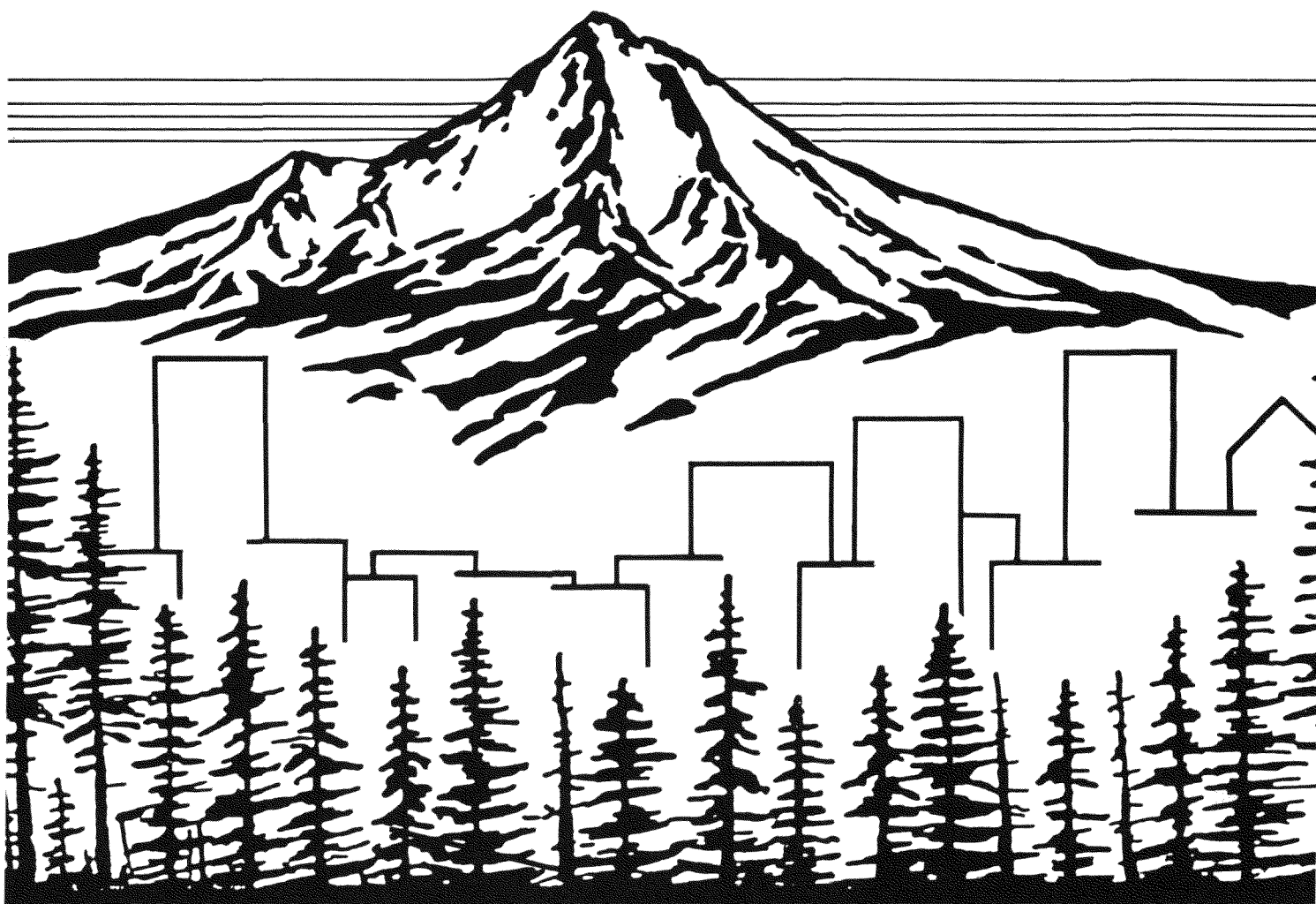

How We Will Use Your Response

Your comments are important in developing a final Forest Plan that is most responsive to public needs, desires, and interests. The more specific your comments are, the better.

After the public review period is over, responses will be analyzed. The Forest Supervisor and the Regional Forester will then review and evaluate the analysis of those responses. They will then use the analyses of the public input along with other factors, including legal requirements, resource capability and protection, environmental effects, and economic stability, to decide on the final Forest Plan.

Steps to be followed in the analysis of public responses:

- Read all responses and identify specific comments.
- Arrange the comments so we can keep track of them.
- Analyze and combine all comments and reasons into categories such as issues, alternatives, adequacy of document, etc.
- Prepare a summary of public responses.
- Evaluate the analysis and consider it when developing the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) or in identifying the need to issue a new Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS).

Once public responses have been analyzed, we will:

- Issue a FEIS or a new DEIS. Include responses to all substantive comments in the new document.
- Announce decision with rationale and direction.
- Mail FEIS or new DEIS.

These 9 Steps Can Help You Prepare Your Response!

STEP 1. The Response Form

This response form has been designed to use with this Reviewer's Guide and with the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, Land and Resource Management Plan, Mt. Hood National Forest.

It is a prepaid, addressed mailer ready to be sent. Just staple, and drop in the mail.

Understanding the issues and alternatives is critical. The issues affect what the Forest produces and the services it provides. Varying levels of goods and services produced by each alternative also produce corresponding and different effects on land, water, resources, and people. The issues and alternatives are described in the Reviewer's Guide and in the DEIS.

There is additional space provided for you to add issues if you feel they have not been addressed. (If you have questions about the issues check the DEIS, Chapter One and Appendix A).

Please place a number (5,4,3,2, or 1) in each box to indicate how you feel each alternative addresses each public issue (5 responds best). You may indicate the importance of the issues to you by ranking them in the box provided (1 = most important).

STEP 4. Commenting on the Alternatives

The following pages have space for your comments on ten alternatives. Select the alternatives you want to comment on and write in the spaces provided. As you make your comment, be sure to discuss strengths and weaknesses, your likes and dislikes, changes you would like to see, and the rationale supporting your comments. Make your comments as specific as you can. Descriptions of the alternatives can be found in Chapter II of the DEIS and in the Reviewer's Guide. You should also look at the alternative maps.

Alternative E has been identified as our preferred alternative. We feel that this will best address the issues identified on the Forest. Please use one space to comment on our preferred alternative.

In making your comments on the alternatives, consider:

- The best balance between local, state, and national needs.
- Keeping options open for the future.
- The best balance between the resources and the goods produced.
- Environmental consequences.

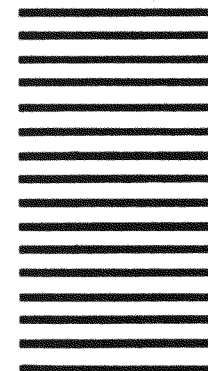
