1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

No action is requested at this time. The briefing session will provide an update of the County's five-year General Fund revenue and expenditure forecast.

County Financial Policies recognize the importance of developing and maintaining a five-year financial forecast for the General Fund in order for the Board to be able to assess the long-term financial implications of current and proposed policies and programs.

The forecast presentation will provide an update of available funding for FY 2014 and beyond; provide context for evaluating financial risk and for assessing the County's ability to sustain services; and identify key variables that might change the level of revenues or expenditures.

The County uses ongoing financial forecasting and monitoring to estimate revenues and expenditures in the General Fund, the County's largest source of discretionary revenues. The five-year forecast helps form the basis on which the County builds its annual budget.

County Financial Policies recognize the importance of developing a combined revenue and expenditure forecast and direct the Budget Office to prepare a five-year financial forecast for the General Fund.
