Reason for Classification Decision:

These 2 new positions (1 FTE & .5 FTE) are in the School-based Mental Health program that provides comprehensive direct mental health services at school-based sites. The purpose of these positions is to enable students who are experiencing or are at risk of mental health disorders to receive comprehensive mental health services in their natural school environment. These positions will provide mental health services to school age children, adolescents and their families with mental, behavioral, familial, and educational problems. These positions will conduct mental health assessments, crisis intervention, crisis response and hospital admission facilitation; triage and referral to community services. The positions will provide clients with interactive individual, family, and group therapy. Qualifications required for these positions are: education equivalent to a Master's degree in the mental health field and at least two years experience in the provision of behavioral health services as a Qualified Mental Health Professional. The duties and qualifications as described above best fit the Mental Health Consultant (6365) classification.
