

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
FOR MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON
ORDINANCE NO. 420

An ordinance amending Multnomah County Code: Title 5 by modifying the procedure for the review and approval of certain liquor license applications.

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

1. That Ordinance No. 412, adopted on March 15, 1984, establishes guidelines for the consideration of liquor license applications.
2. That the procedure established by Ordinance No. 412 does not distinguish between temporary liquor licenses and other types of liquor licenses.
3. That the delay caused by Board review of applications for temporary liquor licenses causes unnecessary inconvenience and scheduling difficulties in obtaining temporary licenses.
4. That temporary liquor licenses, by their nature, do not have a long-term impact and do not generally raise issues requiring review and resolution by the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners directs:

That Multnomah County Code Chapter 5.10 is amended by the creation of a new Section 5.10.020 (G) which shall read as follows:


G. Sheriff's Approval of Temporary License Applications.

On any application for a temporary liquor license which will be in effect for five days or less, review by the Board of County Commissioners shall not be automatically required. The Sheriff is hereby given authority to make a recommendation of approval to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission on such applications. If the Sheriff recommends denial of an application for a temporary license, the application shall be reviewed by the Board of County Commissioners as described in Sections D. and E. above.

ADOPTED this 14th day of June, 1984, being the date of its second reading before the Board of County Commissioners of Multnomah County, Oregon.


