

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

FOR MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON

ORDINANCE NO. 280

An ordinance relating to the sworn law enforcement officers' retirement system; and amending MCC 3.50.010(Q).

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (Q) of MCC 3.50.010 shall be amended to read as follows:

(Q) "Sworn law enforcement officer" means an employe of Multnomah County assigned to the Department of Justice Services, Division of Public Safety, who:

(1) Holds a position in one of the following job classifications [in the classified service of Multnomah County]:

- (a) Captain;
- (b) Lieutenant;
- (c) Sergeant/Detective;
- (d) Identification Technician;
- (e) Deputy Sheriff (Patrolman);
- (f) Deputy Sheriff (Trainee);
- (g) Or in any successor classification to those enumerated in (a) through (f) above.

(2) Holds a position with the county which normally

requires more than 600 hours of service per year, provided, however, that "sworn law enforcement officer" does not include any person classified by the county as a volunteer or reserved deputy sheriff, regardless of the number of hours of service performed per year.
