PROCLAMATION NO. 2010-055

Proclaiming that Multnomah County recognizes May 2-8, 2010, as Correctional Officers and Employees week.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. On May 7, 2007, the US House of Representatives passed Resolution 264, officially marking the first full week of May as National Observance of Correctional Officers and Employees Week.
- b. The operation of correctional facilities represents a crucial component of the criminal justice system of Multnomah County, and that of the United States.
- c. Correctional personnel play a vital role in protecting the right of the public to be safeguarded from criminal activity.
- d. Correctional personnel are responsible for the care, custody, and dignity of the human beings charged to their care.
- e. Correctional personnel work under demanding circumstances and face danger in their daily work lives.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Proclaims:

May 2-8, 2010, as Correctional Officers and Employees Week; to support the goals and ideals of National Correctional Officers and Employees Week, and honor all correctional officers and employees for their service to their communities, Multnomah County, the State of Oregon, and to the Nation.

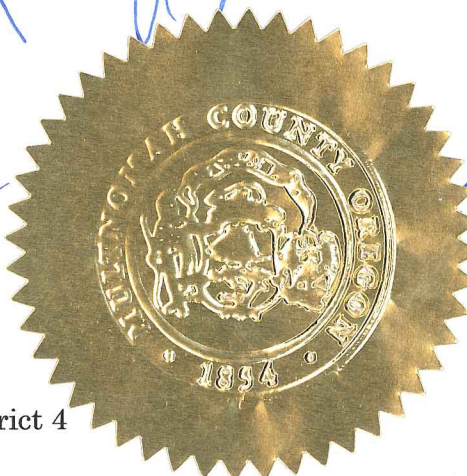
