Dear Attorney General Kroger,

Here is the case information I mentioned in our conversation in the Capitol Bldg. moments ago.

I filed *Stull v. Hoke*, resulting in both 326 Or. 72 (1997) and 153 Or App 261 (1998). In 2004 Dr. Robert J. Grimm (of *Jennings v. Baxter Healthcare* 331 Or 285 (2000)) appeared on my behalf in *State v. Stull* (Mult. Co. Cir Ct Case 0310-35386) which was appealed because I was denied Oregon Medical Marijuana Act defenses using *State v. Owenby* (Or App 2000), a rationale found made obsolete by the Oregon Medical Marijuana Act as determined in *State v. Miles* (2005) by the Oregon Court of Appeals. - and also because of my conviction based on possession of marijuana which was not "usable marijuana" (as determined in *State v. Castilleja* - which cites *Stull* on the desents footnote on page 269 of the Oregon Court of Appeals opinion).

In 2005, PCRI filed 05F015732 under ORS 90.427(2) against the prohibition in ORS 105.120 (2003) - when my rent was paid in advance. That appeal was thwarted when PCRI twice destroyed my goods in 2006 and the court struck 42 font brief (CA A130567).

We note that you have already forwarded the complaint to the Civil Rights Coordinator, Civil Division, US Attorney's Office. We believe that is an appropriate office to review the issues you have raised.

We appreciate when the public writes to us, as you have, about consumer problems. By attempting to avoid duplicating the work of other government agencies, we keep our staff available to assist consumers who have nowhere else to turn. In addition, the Oregon Department of Justice does not have authority to enforce the Oregon Residential Landlord and Tenant Act, and we cannot represent private individuals in private legal matters before the court, or previously decided by the court. We hope you will understand the limit of our authority in this matter.

Your complaint will remain on our record and may provide a source of valuable information to interested members of the public or other law enforcement agencies who inquire.

Dear Mr. Stull:

The United States Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon has carefully reviewed your Civil Rights Complaint Form dated June 25, 2009, as well as supplemental materials you provided to this office on July 17, 2009; August 7, 2009; August 21, 2009; October 2, 2009; November 24, 2009; and December 4, 2009.

After carefully reviewing your complaint and the supplemental materials, we have determined that the facts and circumstances you describe do not raise a federal issue of Civil Rights enforcement for the United States Attorney to address. Therefore, we are taking no further action with respect to your complaint. In addition, we are not aware of another federal agency with authority to handle the concerns you raise.

While I understand you have represented yourself pro se, you may wish to consult with a private attorney to determine whether any redress can be achieved through the legal process in the nature of a private civil action.
